

# New Pressure For Story Behind Diplomats' Flight

LONDON (AP) — Members of Parliament are putting new pressure on the foreign office to tell all it knows about the two British diplomats who disappeared behind the Iron Curtain in 1951. There appeared to be a growing conviction that the story behind the flight of the two is being hushed up.

The pair—Donald Maclean, 38, and Guy Burgess, 40—vanished May 26, 1951, after stepping off an excursion boat at St. Malo, France. Two years and four months later, Maclean's American-born wife, Melinda, slipped out of sight in Switzerland with her three children, presumably to join her husband.

## THE LATE FRANK X. DORSEY

The festive season was saddened for the family, relatives and many friends of the late Frank X. Dorsey, when he was called so suddenly to his Eternal Home on the morning of Dec. 27th, 1954.

He was in his usual good spirits, and with his family had spent Christmas with his daughter and son-in-law. Mr. and Mrs. James Hamill and family as had been his custom for many years.

On Sunday, Dec. 28th, he complained of not feeling well and on returning home, medical aid was summoned, but to no avail. God willed otherwise. During his last hours on earth he was visited by his pastor, Rev. Reginald MacDonald and by Rev. Preston Hamill, and died as he had lived fortified by the last holy rites of the Catholic Church.

He was born in Charlottetown in 1889 the youngest of a family of twelve, of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Dorsey.

In 1909 he joined the C. N. R., and served faithfully for forty-five years, until he retired as an engineer in August of 1954. He enjoyed his retirement for only four months to the fullest extent; and still took an active interest in all railway activities.

His memory is cherished and mourned by his sorrowing wife, the former Mildred Farmer, his two daughters and five sons, namely: Beryl, Mrs. James Hamill, Mid-

leton; Doreen, attending Miss Corcoran's Business College, Charlottetown; James, with the Canada Packers, Charlottetown; Frank, with the Ford Motor Co., Oakville; Ralph, with the General Electric Co., Peterborough; Walter, with the Metropolitan Life Insurance, Brantford; and Joe, a C.N.R. operator in Borden. Also three sisters and one brother: May, Mrs. A. E. Hogan, Portland, Oregon; Ella, Mrs. F. J. O'Neill, Saint John, N. B.; Ethel, Mrs. F. F. Sigsworth, Charlottetown; and John in California; also fifteen grandchildren.

The funeral, which was largely attended, took place from his home to the Sacred Heart Church, Borden, where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Reginald MacDonald, assisted by Rev. Preston Hamill. Also present in the sanctuary was Rev. Harold Croken who officiated at the grave in St. Malachy's Cemetery, Kinkora where all that was mortal of a kind and loving husband, father and grandfather was tenderly laid to rest, there to await a glorious resurrection.

The pallbearers were his five sons and son-in-law.
