Octoberfest is being seen to by a collaboration amongst Ray Shalala, Gerald McDonald, and Tom Hayward.

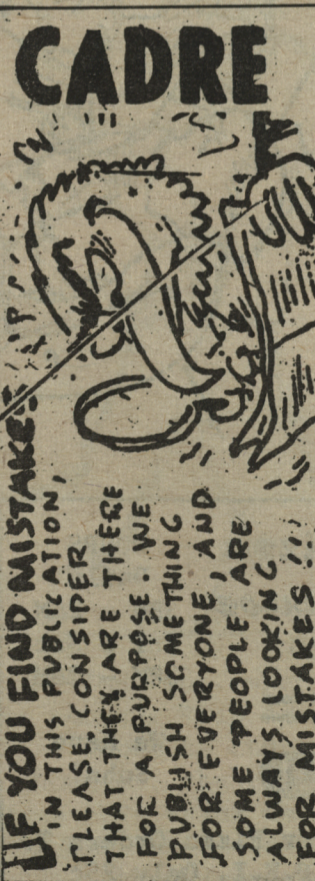
