Local and Other Items.

SIGNS OF PROSPERITY.—The Montreal Times comes to hand enlarged to the extent of a column a page. The enlargement has been made necessary by the increased advertising patronage. The Times is a capital newspaper, and it is pleasing to note that its worth is being so substantially recognized.

VERY OLD MAN.—Lew's Peter, of Blissfield, Mich., is believed to be one of the oldest men in the United States. He was born in Montreal in 1786, and was 112 years old on the 11th day of August last. Mr. Peter has never tasted tobacco in any form, and enjoys very good health, considering his great age.

COW HAS SMALL POX.—The inspectors of the Montreal Health Department have discovered a case of spontaneous small pox in a cow belonging to a milkman at Cote St. Michael. The sale of milk was at once stopped in the city and steps taken to prevent the spread of the disease. Such cases are said to be extremely rare and it has raised quite an amount of interest in scientific circles.

A CIVIC SENSATION.—Halifax has a civic sensation. It seems that the son of an alderman has received contracts from the city amounting to many thousands of dollars for laying asphalt sidewalks. The mayor refused to issue a warrant for the payment of the money to the contractor, claiming that the work had been disgracefully done, and that the city engineer had no right to certify that the work had been properly finished. The engineer and mayor had some hot words and some serious charges were made. The mayor demanded the production of the contract, and the engineer replied that he could not produce it as it had been lost. The mayor has received a letter from a lawyer threatening suit. Investigation has been called for. Sensational developments are looked for.

BURNED TO DEATH.—The death took place on Friday morning, at Halifax, of Stanley Sutherland, aged six years, an exceptionally bright little fellow, under extremely sad conditions. The boy was the son of Joseph E. Sutherland. On Wednesday morning after getting up, he stood by the kitchen fire in his night dress, warming himself, while his mother was in another room getting her clothes. While playing with the fire his night dress caught, and in a moment he was enveloped in flames. The mother heard the piercing screams and ran to his assistance, but before she reached him the boy was past recovery. His body was frightfully burned. It is credible as it may appear, the deceased never lost consciousness. Life slowly ebbed, until Friday morning, when death ensued.

The Filipino Situation.

MANILA, April 8.—Gen. MacArthur's operations consist temporarily in reconnoissances in various directions for the purpose of keeping in touch with the rebels and ascertaining their movements. The Fourth Cavalry and two guns were out all the morning in the direction of Baisasin, a little north of Malolos. In the meantime, the dredgers were busy clearing the channel of the Rio Grande to Pampanga.

The United States double turret monitor Monadnock is patrolling the bay in the vicinity of Bakoar, keeping the rebels in motion and dropping occasional shells among them in response to their musketry fire.

Susal, reported to have been bombarded by the Baltimore, is merely a suburb of Daguian, which as was cabled to the Associated Press on Thursday morning last, was bombarded by the United States cruiser Charleston, last Saturday because one of her boats was fired upon and an officer was wounded while in-shore making soundings.

The Prussian diet is disturbed over the question of an appropriation for a carpet for the chamber of deputies. Many of the deputies, including Count Limber, are opposed to the idea because so many of the members are chronic tobacco chewers.
