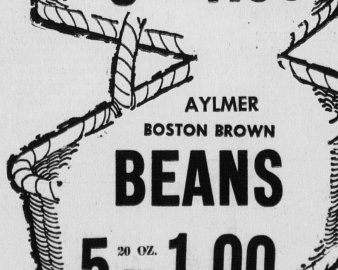
Centennial Clean Up - Week
