Anti-Negro Tirade Stirs Ire Of Panel

TORONTO (CP) — Racial segregation was defended Wednesday night by a participant on the CBC's television panel show Live a Borrowed Life.
George Rolland, a Toronto watchmaker, appeared on the show to "borrow" the life of Abraham Lincoln and went into an anti-Negro tirade when asked by panel members about Lincoln's views on segregation.
Mr. Rolland, who ran in the last Ontario provincial election under the self-styled White Canada party banner, said there was no such thing as equality between the Negro and white races.
Moderator Charles Templeton tried to interrupt but Mr. Rolland continued, apparently along the lines of a prepared speech, saying that God didn't create all people equal.

Highway Base Made Of Coal

FRANKFORT (AP) — Kentucky Wednesday laid the first strip of highway using a coal-base mixture.
The project—if it proves successful—could create a greatly expanded market for the coal mining industry.
It could also bring about cheaper and better roads.
Nearly a mile stretch of U.S. 460 east of Frankfort was paved with the new material as more than 100 state officials and representatives of Curtiss - Wright Corporation watched.
Curtiss - Wright developed the coal-base road paving binding using bituminous coal rather than tar materials now used in bituminous surfacing. The work was done at its Susquehanna, Pa., plant.

Trade Deficit Rises Sharply

OTTAWA (CP)—A rapid rise in Canadian buying abroad this year, together with a fall-off in export sales to all markets but the United States, has put Canadian trade figures deeply in the red.
A trade deficit of \$450,000,000 in the first seven months of the year—an excess of imports over exports—was reported Wednesday by the bureau of statistics. That was more than double the deficit of \$198,700,000 a year earlier.
