LONDON (AP) — Britain claimed a world official altitude record for aircraft Friday—70,000 feet. The Royal Aero Club said the new mark was set two days ago by a Canberra bomber, powered by two turbo-jets and two rocket motors. It was piloted by Michael Randrup, chief test pilot for D. Napier and Son. The previous official record was 65,890 feet, set by a Canberra in 1955.
