

Stevenson for Washington's reaction and Stevenson said separate U.S. soundings through Canadian channels in Hanoi had convinced Washington that Ho had no interest in peace.

This conclusion seemed unreasonable to Thant, who thought: If he wanted strictly private talks, how could he be expected to disclose to a Canadian questioner the possibility of them? Also Thant learned that the Canadian channels in Hanoi had no direct access to Ho. On his own, Stevenson asked

Thant how talks could take place. Thant suggested local ambassadorial talks between U.S. and North Vietnamese envoys in Rangoon. Still on his own, Stevenson asked Thant Jan. 16, 1965, if Burma would agree.

Thant said two days later Burma would agree to such a meeting and Stevenson reported this to Washington. Ten days later, Washington rejected the proposed Rangoon meeting, arguing that any rumor of such a meeting might topple the Saigon government.

Former War Pilot Gambles Ladies To Go For Pink Mink

EDMONTON (CP) — John Caine is betting \$25,000 that three years from now the ladies will think pink mink.

As a Second World War fighter pilot, Mr. Caine accounted for 22 enemy aircraft and won the Distinguished Flying Cross with two bars. He has been in the fur business ever since and hasn't been shot down yet.

Unlike the split-second gambling of the air ace, the fur trade is a game in which the player has to wait a long time until he is dealt his last card.

"You have to guess the market five years in advance," Mr. Caine explained. "Then you

gamble \$20,000 to \$25,000 on your guess."

He made his guess two years ago when he bought 36 female pink mink and started to breed them. Some will be ready for the market next year but it will be another two years before their full potential is realized.

TOOK OVER DAD'S FARM

Mr. Caine first dealt himself into the game when he took over his father's fur farm, following his return from the RCAF.

In 1947, he bought three palomino mink that a small rancher found in his herd. Five years

later, he sold 2,300 palomino pelts at top prices.

Meanwhile, he crossed palomino with sapphires to produce the popular pearl shade, from which he expects to make \$100,000 this year. He estimates his total crop will bring close to \$500,000.

Mr. Caine's profitable guess work isn't done with a crystal ball.

He makes three flying trips a year to Europe and four to Eastern Canada, as well as occasional visits to New York, Los Angeles, Mexico City and other

major fur markets to study trends.

He also finds time to relax. On his office wall is a six-foot sailfish, caught last February in Acapulco, Mexico.

Washington Opposition Reported To Peace Talks

NEW YORK (AP) — Newsweek quotes UN Secretary-General U Thant as saying he tried three times to arrange Viet Nam peace talks between Washington and Hanoi in late 1964 and early 1965 but met resistance from Washington each time.

our indications were that there was no serious intent on the other side," the state department said in November, 1964.

In the article, Hughes also said: "To this day (Secretary of State Dean) Rusk assures Thant that Stevenson was never authorized to reject the Rangoon meeting but was merely advised of the secretary's skepticism."

In an interview with columnist Emmet John Hughes, Thant is quoted as saying he worked with the late Adlai Stevenson, then U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, to try to set up peace talks.

Thant returned from a trip to Paris, Cairo and Moscow in August 1964 and was invited to Washington to meet with President Johnson and the path to any peace conference had to be cleared with private, unofficial talks.

Stevenson was receptive to the three tries, Newsweek quotes Thant, but Washington remained silent the first, rejected the second on the basis of reported U.S. soundings through Canadian channels in Hanoi.

In early September, Thant sent a message to North Vietnamese President Ho Chi Minh asking if he would agree to such unofficial talks. He sent word he would agree to send an envoy to meet a Washington envoy.

The U.S. bombings of North Viet Nam began early in 1965, a day after Hanoi received a message from Thant telling of Washington's rejection of peace talks, the secretary-general is quoted.

Thant relayed this to Stevenson, but there was no reply from Washington.

REJECTED OFFER

The state department said then that Thant had sent word in the fall of 1964 that North Viet Nam was willing to enter into talks with the United States at Rangoon, Burma. The U.S. rejected the offer because "all
