**Supreme Ct.
Pays Tribute
To Late MLA**

MONTAGUE — The November sitting of the Supreme Court of Prince Edward Island was held in Georgetown yesterday with Mr. Justice Mark R. McGuitan presiding.

No cases were on the docket for the consideration of the court. Mr. Justice McGuitan paid a tribute to the late S. S. Hessian, QC, MLA, and extended the sympathy of the court and its officials to Mrs. Hessian and to Stephen Hessian, Jr., son of the deceased.

In his remarks Mr. Justice McGuitan reviewed the long and distinguished career of the late Mr. Hessian in the legal profession and in the field of politics and public service. He recalled that the deceased was the oldest practicing attorney in the province from the point of service, having been admitted to the bar in 1916 which meant he had practiced law for 46 years.
