IN MEMORIAM

R. T. WHITE The death occurred in the P.E.I. Hospital on Sunday afternoon, June 15th, after a short illness, of Mr. R. Thomas White, well known grocery store proprietor of 133 Elm Avenue. Mr. White was suddenly stricken a few days before and taken at once to the hospital where efforts to advance his recovery were unavailing. Mr. White, born in Charlottetown in 1893, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas White, both of whom are still living.

A lifelong member of Zion Presbyterian Church, and of the Odd Fellows and Sons of England, Mr. White enjoyed a large circle of friends in the social and fraternal life of the community, as well as business connections. He had been in business for 30 years.

Besides his parents, he is survived by his wife, Mrs. Annie Lauretta (Wood) White, one son Roy, and five daughters, Mrs. Fred Whelan (May), Mrs. Ralph Small (Eleanor), Mrs. Lloyd MacNevin (Rose), Mrs. John Davies (Edith), and Myrtle, all of whom reside in the city, and 15 grandchildren. The funeral was held June 18th from the MacLean Funeral Home to Zion Presbyterian Church where the service was conducted by Mr. John A. Johnston, M.A., and the Rev. T. H. B. Somers, M.A., in place of the Rev. G. C. Webster who was absent. During the service Mr. John A. MacLeod sang as the solo, "Does Jesus Care?" and the choir of Zion sang the 109th and 19th Psalms.

R. T. WHITE The death occurred in the P.E.I. Hospital on Sunday afternoon, June 15th, after a short illness, of Mr. R. Thomas White, well known grocery store proprietor of 133 Elm Avenue.
