

# Nyons Demand On Prairies Leads To Winnipeg Plant

WINNIPEG (CP) — To keep pace with the demand of the women in western Canada for their product—gossamer-light nylon stockings—a Montreal firm has opened a plant in greater Winnipeg.

president of Doris Hosiery Mills Ltd., said the firm's plant there was an output of about 12,000 dozen pairs of nylons a week but could not keep up with the demand from western Canada. This resulted in the opening Oct. 21 of Greater Winnipeg's first hosiery plant, a \$500,000 opera-

tioned as long ago as 1940, many women still do not really know how to buy them.

NEED CARE for the nylons. When nylons were scarce, women were eager for information on how to wear and care for them. Nowadays, women complain that their stockings don't last, but they don't do very much to make them last.

In 1946, all Canadian-made nylons were either 20 or 30 cent but today he said only 10 per cent of Canadian production is in deniers heavier than 15.

The lower the denier number the sheerer the stocking. Denier refers to thickness of the yarn and gauge stands for the number of stitches to the inch.

"If women really want nylons of post-war quality, they should buy them in the post-war deniers. Expecting a gossamer-light 15-denier stocking to stand unlike one twice its weight is like expecting the lifts on broad heels of a walking shoe to last longer than the soles of the shoe."

The new hosiery plant here is only the second to establish in the west.

The first was built at Teron, Man., 30 miles north of here, and was bought by Sheer Nylons Hosiery Ltd., two years ago by Sheer Nyl., who employ 15 salesmen and have a new plant at Coakville, Ont.

WORK ON 24 HOUR BASIS  
The plant here will produce ladies' and teenagers' full length stockings in Canadian and textured styles from Manish material and labor on a 24-hour basis.

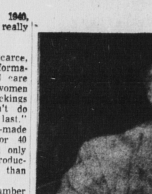
Mr. Hasen, in an interview, said Manitoba was selected as the site of his firm's first branch plant because of its proximity to the training centers undertaken by the Manitoba government. On-line training for girls takes an average of about six weeks.

With a branch demand for the sheer nylons, Mr. Hasen says his firm is not seeking new customers and has an sales organization as such.

The plant is not set up to serve new customers but to look after the western Canadian retailers with whom business has been conducted in the past and we expect sales to reach about \$1,000,000 annually.

Mr. Hasen said western retailers will also be interested in his reduction of shipping costs, particularly for retail customers, as well as his express, when retailers have a branch demand for the sheer nylons.

R. Hasen, active in the hosiery business since 1926, said he is a native of the United States.
