Georgetown Council In Lengthy Session

A four-hour-long meeting of the Georgetown Town Council was held in the Council Chambers on Tuesday night, with Mayor Howard S. MacLean presiding. Councillors present were: Lavers, Currie, McConnell, MacLean, MacDonald, and Johnson. During the meeting the Council was visited by Mr. Charles McConnell, fire chief and Mr. Paul Batchelder, fire brigade captain. They waited on the Council, as representatives of the Volunteer Fire Fighting Brigade, which was recently formed by the Lions Club, and contains eleven members. Pending the passing of a by-law officially sanctioning the Fire Brigade, it will operate and hold practice drills under authorization of the Council, by a motion passed at Tuesday's meeting. A motion was also passed authorizing the spending of \$200 for new equipment for the brigade and it is expected that a further amount will be voted for equipment when the town enters its new fiscal year in January. FINANCIAL REPORT The financial report submitted by Councillor Lavers, showed that on ordinary account the sum of \$1773.35 had been spent in October, with receipts amounting to \$870.20. The balance on hand and in the bank as of October 31st was \$4,347.97. Bills amounting to \$76.11 were certified for payment and bills amounting to \$916.61 were approved for payment. In the Capital Expenditure account the October balance stood at \$2306.33. The final progress payment of the Sewage System amounting to \$3236.05 was approved for payment and the Council approved the borrowing of \$2000 to meet this progress payment, and have sufficient in the account for interest payments. To date a total of \$70,000 has been borrowed against the guaranteed loan at the bank amounting to \$80,000 for sewer installation. The 15 percent holdback on the sewage system amounts to \$8,662.02. With the approval of the final progress payment, and as the Atlantic Development System has been turned over to the Prince Edward Island Industrial Corporation, residents of the Town are now permitted to hook up onto the sewage system and should obtain their permits to do this from the town clerk's office. Councillor MacLean reporting for the Street Committee, stated that sixty-nine loads of gravel have been placed on town streets, with sixty-four loads having been placed on Grafton Street between Victoria and East Streets. Drains have been opened; traffic signs erected and culverts installed. Sand will be stockpiled for winter use on town streets. Councillor MacDonald, for the Fire Committee, reported that the tank truck had been repaired and that repairs to the small fire truck and servicing and also repairs to the fire hall oil heater would be done in the very near future. Councillor McConnell reported for the Public Property Committee and certain repairs to the rink building were discussed. Councillor Currie reporting for the Street Light and Welfare Committee asked that a street light be installed on Gordon Street between Fitzroy Street and Weeks Crescent. On motion of the Council it was decided to request the Maritime Electric Company to install this light. POLICE COMMITTEE Councillor Johnson reporting for the Police Committee, stated that the new police car had been received by the town, and asked for and was granted permission to purchase a second police uniform. He reported that the town dump was being operated efficiently. He recommended and received Council approval for the erection of no-parking signs in front of the fire hall. The clerk was instructed to make the necessary inquiries regarding the insuring of the members of the fire brigade. A building permit application from Mr. Alan Herberj Altass, for the remodelling of a building on Grafton Street, east of Victoria Street for a restaurant, and to be known as Tudor Restaurant was granted. NQ TENDERS There were no tenders received for the operation of the rink for the 1966-67 season. The Council decided to call further tenders for the rink operation and they will close on December 10. On the question of Winter Works the Council will make 1 immediate application for the amount up to \$4000 for the cutting and burning of bushes; Centennial Park project work; work on rink; sign erection and swimming beach clean-up and improvement. Correspondence revealed that the official population of the town is now set at 819 for per capita grants. The Centennial per capita grants are based on the former population figure of 744. It was decided that Mr. Laurie A. Coles, of Laurie A. Coles and Associates, will meet with the Council on matters relating to the sewer system on Wednesday night. A letter was read from Hon. M.L. Bonnell, Minister of Tourism regarding improvement and clean-up of properties, publicly and privately owned in connection with the 1967 Centennial observance. SEWER RATES Correspondence was also read from the Public Utilities Board regarding the setting of Sewer rates. A letter from Hon. George Ferguson, Minister of Public Works and Highways regarding the town's request for the stationing of a snow plow in Georgetown, stated that the Minister agreed with the necessity of stationing a snow plow there and that every consideration would be given this matter when the allocation of a snow plow was made by the Department. The clerk was instructed to write to the Prince Edward Island Industrial Corporation, requesting that they deed back to the town of Georgetown, a portion of former Common Lands in Lot No. 27, situated at the intersection of Victoria and North Streets. The request is for an amount of land having a frontage on Kent Street measuring 200 feet and running west on North Street for a distance of 150 feet. The town is desirous of obtaining this land for lease to the Lions Club on which to erect a Lion's Community Hall.
