British See Next Step In Trade Up To Canada

LONDON (CP)—British financial commentators see the relaxation of Britain's restrictions on dollar imports as a challenge to Canada to reciprocate with trade concessions of her own.

"In politics it can often be embarrassing to get too much of what one asks for," the Financial Times observes, noting that Prime Minister Diefenbaker and Finance Minister Fleming had campaigned vigorously for removal of British discriminatory legislation against the dollar area.

"Nobody wishes to criticize the Canadian government, but it must be clear to Mr. Diefenbaker and Mr. Fleming that it is up to them to take the next initiative."

NO TARIFF ATTACK
The Economist takes an even sharper tone. It criticized British delegates at the Commonwealth economic conference in Montreal for not accompanying their announcement on dollar restrictions with an expression of concern at recent Canadian tariff increases against British goods.

While praising the work of Canadian civil servants at the conference, the weekly newspaper adds:

By contrast, Canada's new Conservative ministers are, frankly, very inexperienced men and Mr. Fleming does not always seem to appreciate the difference between program planning and propaganda.

The Daily Express, on the other hand, denounces the British concessions as "just make-believe" and "a shabby pretence."

EMPIRE ON SALMON!
The newspaper, published by Canadian-born Lord Beaverbrook, continues:

"Restrictions on the import of Canadian salmon are to be lifted. That will affect less than one per cent of our trade with Canada. The Empire will not grow strong on canned salmon."

"Then there is agricultural machinery. That too now may be freely imported. But Britain is the biggest exporter of agricultural machinery in the world. That concession too is worthless."

Other newspapers hail the disappearance of dollar restrictions as an excellent move in itself and some speculate that the British concession may have been part of a 'deal' with Canada.

The Daily Mail mentions a rumor in Montreal that Canada will reciprocate by cancelling Britain's £400,000,000 debt for Canadian wartime and post-war loans, provided Britain agrees to invest the money in Commonwealth development.

The newspaper says such a move, which would cost the Canadian government £12,500,000 a year, might be counted as part of Canada's capital subscription to the proposed Commonwealth development bank.

Pearkes To Make Tour Of Arctic

OTTAWA (CP)—Defence Minister Pearkes will make his first inspection of Arctic air defences next week.

The defence department announced Friday Mr. Pearkes will leave Monday on a four-day trip that also will include a visit to the United States Arctic air base at Thule, Greenland.

He will inspect a Mid-Canada Warning Line site at Great Whale River, on the southeastern shore of Hudson Bay, Monday, flying to Frobisher Bay on Baffin Island for the night.

After inspecting Frobisher and a DEW radar warning line site on Baffin Island Tuesday, he will visit Thule, leaving the next day for Cambridge Bay, on Victoria Island's south coast, and stopping en route at Resolute Bay on Cornwallis Island deep inside the Arctic Circle.

FLIES TO OTTAWA
From Cambridge Bay where he will see another DEW line site, he will fly to Ottawa Thursday.

Deputy Defence Minister Miller, Air Marshal Hugh Campbell, the chief of air staff, Lt.-Gen. S. F. Clarke, the army chief of staff, and Maj.-Gen. J. C. Jensen of the U.S. Air Force, will accompany Mr. Pearkes.

"ATTACK" U.K. PORTS
LONDON (Reuters) — For the first time in any NATO exercise simulated attacks were made Friday by submarines firing guided nuclear missiles, and Liverpool, Swansea, Plymouth, Cardiff and Falmouth were added to major British and French ports "attacked," NATO said. It was the second day of Exercise Shiplash by ships and planes from Belgium, France, West Germany, the Netherlands, Portugal and Britain.

Is Sentenced To Hang For Murder Of Girl Friend

ST. CATHARINES, Ont. (CP)—Robert Carroll, 20, Friday was sentenced to hang for murder in the knife slaying last May of Lynn Redman, his 16-year-old girl friend.

A Supreme Court jury deliberated three hours and 40 minutes before returning a verdict. The sentence is to be carried out Dec. 2.

The slaying took place on a lonely country road after the couple had attended a drive-in movie and quarrelled.

Police testified they had found the girl's body in a car parked in front of her home. A bone-handled hunting knife lay nearby. The defence entered a plea of insanity.

The boy's mother, Mrs. William Carroll, said her son had left school in grade six to work as a delivery boy in a canning factory.

She said he had been out of work for several months before the girl's death and that he loved her and wanted to marry her.

Crew Of Ditched Plane Picked Up

NEW YORK (AP)—The 11-man crew of a ditched U.S. Navy plane headed for Bermuda Sunday aboard a coast guard cutter with their crippled craft in tow.

A Norwegian tanker plucked the crew from the Atlantic last night, about 180 miles north of Bermuda, after the plane ditched with a disabled engine. The plane was one of two on weather patrol.

The Norwegian tanker, the 11,700-ton Bjorsund, took the navy men aboard as two coast guard cutters and a coast guard plane sped to the rescue.
