Rain And Snow Forecast As Island Votes Today

Rain and high winds forced voters in today's Prince Edward Island general election.

Bad weather was predicted for the island province of 105,000 for most of the 9 a.m.-5 p.m. voting hours as an intense snow moved in on the Maritimes.

Sixty candidates will be contesting the 20 legislative seats in a straight fight between the sitting Progressive Conservative government and Liberal opposition.

Premier Walter R. Shaw, who will be 75 in 10 days, called the election a month ago in a bid to abolish hospital insurance premiums which now cost P.E.I. families \$48 a year. The cost would be paid out of general revenues.

Alex Matheson, six-foot-six former premier, immediately announced his resignation. His party, if elected, would abolish the premiums and reduce the hospital tax to 20 cents.

Mr. Shaw proposes a rebate as of Dec. 1.

OFFER INDUCEMENTS

PREMIER SHAW

NEW DELHI (AP) — India accused Communist China Sunday of making an unprovoked thrust that India must accept Peking-dictated terms or face a renewal of their undeclared war.

The spokesman for the Indian foreign ministry assailed a Peking statement issued Saturday which alleged that India had agreed to six non-aligned nations which will meet in Colombo, Ceylon, today in an effort to bring about solution of the India-Red China border dispute.

There was no official response from Prime Minister Nehru's government to a follow-up Chinese note Sunday which demanded that India give a "clear and definite" answer to Chinese proposals for peace along their battle-torn Himalayan border.
