Governor General has distinguished career

The Governor General of Canada, General, The Right Honourable Georges Philias Vanier, D.S.O., M.C., C.D., was born in Montreal, on April 23, 1883. He was educated at Loyola College, Montreal, and at Laval University, where he received B.A. and L.B. degrees. General Vanier served overseas from 1915 to 1918 during the First World War. He was wounded and mentioned in despatches.

In 1921, he married Pauline Archer, daughter of the Honourable Mr. Justice Charles Archer. General Vanier commanded the Royal 22e Regiment from 1925 to 1928. He was one of the Canadian delegates to the Assembly of the League of Nations in 1920. From 1931 to 1938, His Excellency was Secretary at the Office of the High Commissioner for Canada in London. Subsequently, General Vanier became Canadian Minister to France from 1939 to 1940, and from 1943 to 1944 was Canadian Representative to the French committee of National Liberation. His Excellency then was appointed Canadian Ambassador to France. He occupied this post from 1944 until his retirement from the foreign service in 1953.

On September 15, 1959, General Vanier was appointed Governor General of Canada. His Excellency has since travelled extensively throughout the country, even as far as Inuvik, N.W.T., in 1961.

General Vanier is the author of two publications, "Paroles de Guerre" and "Un Canadien Parle aux Français".

Her Excellency Madame Georges P. Vanier was born in Montreal, the daughter of the Honourable Mr. Justice Charles Archer and Mrs. Archer (née Therese de Salaberry).

Madame Vanier was educated at the Sacred Heart Convent in Montreal; and on September 29, 1921, she married Georges P. Vanier. The family includes one daughter and four sons.

Madame Vanier worked energetically for the Voluntary Air Department of the St. John's Ambulance during the First World War, and was a representative of the Canadian Red Cross in France during the Second World War.

Her Excellency is a Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur, a Dame of Matristal Grace of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem.

In June, 1964, General and Madame Vanier sponsored the Canadian Conference on the Family. The Conference was held at Carleton University, Ottawa. Since the family life of the Vaniers has been a rich and rewarding experience, it has, therefore, been the wish of the distinguished couple that a close look at family life in Canada

was chosen Leader of the Liberal Party of Canada, and became Prime Minister of Canada following the general elections of 1963.

The present Prime Minister is the author of many articles and of two published volumes. The first, which appeared in 1955, is entitled "Democracy in World Politics". The second, "Diplomacy in the Nuclear Age", was published in 1959. Mr. Pearson is married and has two children

3 Canadian destroyers escort yacht

The Royal Canadian Navy escorts for the Britannia during the present visit are the destroyer escorts Assiniboine, Nipigon, St. Laurent, and Yukon. They sailed from Halifax Friday to rendezvous with HMV Britannia in the Gulf.

H.M.C.S. Assiniboine (DDE-254) was first commissioned at Sorel, P.Q. in 1958, and after a 14-month conversion was recommissioned in mid-1963. She has a helicopter flight deck and hangar and anti-rol fins, and carries the twin jet Sea King all-weather helicopter, fitted with submarine detection and homing torpedoes. Assiniboine is 366 feet long, displaces 2,900 tons and carries a crew of 228.

H.M.C.S. Nipigon (DDE-228) is of the new "Annapolis" class and was commissioned in 1955. She has recently been converted to handle the Sea King helicopter. The use of the helicopter multiplies several times the radius of effective and submarine action of the vessel. The ship is also equipped with the Canadian-designed and built variable depth sonar.

H.M.C.S. St. Laurent is the first ship constructed under the destroyer-building program in 1953. She has recently been converted to handle the Sea King helicopter. Her round hull lines counter ice-formation in winter and aid the washing away of radioactive contamination. Her speed is 28 knots, length is 366 feet, displacement is 2,900 tons, and she carries a crew of 312 officers and men.
