notrump were rewarded for their conservation with a good score.

One pair managed to get a top score by bidding and making six clubs! This peculiar contract was reached when North opened with spade and South chose to respond two clubs.

North raised to four clubs, which was reasonable enough, and South, eschewing any other bids, went directly to six clubs. West led the jack of diamonds and South could count only ten top tricks. So he embarked on a cross-ruff to try to pick up two more tricks.

After taking the ace of diamonds he cashed the A-K of spades, discarding a heart, and ruffed a spade. Then he played the king of diamonds and ruffed a diamond. Next he cashed the A-K of hearts and ruffed his last diamond. With the lead in dummy, this was now the position:

Bridge hand diagram showing cards in North and South hands.

When the jack of spades was now led from dummy, East was helpless. It did not matter whether he ruffed with the six or the ace in either case, South was bound to make his eight for the trick.
