

Ayers Forestry Club Stages First Annual Field Program

Under the direction of Frank Gaudet, provincial director of forestry, with the local leader and five assistants, a group of 45 pupils from grades six and seven were taken by chartered bus to collect leaf specimens from island trees as part of the EYO Ayers-Memorial 4-H Forestry Club first annual field day recently.

The group left Stella Maris Regional High School in the morning for different sections of the province — Cherry Valley, Sir Andrew MacPhail Park and Iona — where various types of trees are found. Mr. Gaudet pointed out distinctions among varieties of maple and pine, and lectured them on the appreciation of and respect for trees.

During the tour the club members had the opportunity of visiting such places as the new Holy Redeemer Church and Confederation Centre in Charlottetown. At the Centre Robert Leclair conducted a lecture

The students had lunch at the MacPhail Park, where they also enjoyed its many facilities. They later went to Wood Island where they saw the new ferry Prince Nova coming into dock, and finally toured the Montague

Museum, which proved of great interest to the Foresters. The return journey to Stella Maris was completed by early evening, to end what was for the Foresters a profitable trip and a happy day.
