CANADIAN IS THE BEST.

Views of British Officer on Army Horses in Transvaal.

Major J. H. Phillips, of the British army, has arrived at New Orleans to take charge of the shipment of mules and horses from New Orleans to South Africa, or such other points where the British army need them. It is given out that 3,000 more mules have already been ordered, and 2,000 more horses, and that four British transports are already on their way here for their transportation. Whether the purchases will be continued beyond the 5,000 already ordered will depend on circumstances. Major Phillips has been engaged in buying mules for the British army in Spain and Italy. The Spanish mules were shipped through Gibraltar and San Sebastian, but the British Government has decided to confine itself wholly to America. The Canadian horses had been found best for service in Africa. The reason of the continued demand for pack mules long after all that were supposed to be needed had been shipped to Africa was due to the heavy losses. The animals suffered not only from the African insects and the diseases peculiar to that country, but from lack of food and the heavy work and long marches. In three days Gen French had lost 6,000 of his 9,000 mules. The compact heavy set cavalry horse had stood the war in South Africa better than the mule, as he did not require as much food.

IT ALL DEPENDS ON PREACHING.

People come to hear, not to adore. —They speak of God's ministers as "preachers," as if that was their chief occupation instead of leading their brethren in the worship of God—they cannot understand daily services of prayer and praise, when only two or three are gathered together in Christ's name, without preaching. They call the part of the service which comes before the sermon "preliminaries," they wonder why we waste time with so much prayer and scripture-reading and praise when it might be used more profitably in preaching. People say to me sometimes, intending it as a compliment, "I must come down to hear you some Sunday," or, "I have been several times to hear you preach, but it has always been some one else." How flattered God must feel to know that men go to His House, not to worship Him, but to hear me preach!

So much is the sermon everything, with many Christians, that a minister can hope for no promotion unless he is a good preacher. When a church is vacant, applicants are required to preach trial sermons, and are judged thereby. This does not apply so much perhaps to the Church of England, yet it is undoubtedly true that with us also other qualities are overlooked, and unless a man has a certain amount of "pulpit power" as it is called, he is left in obscurity.
