Mr. and Mrs. Allan Collett of Toronto have been visiting with Mr. Collett's grandmother, Mrs. Flossie Lowther, this village.

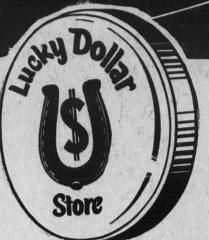

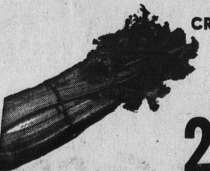
