Favorite Shooting Spot Brings Back Memories

One evening this week my partner and I drove out to the Old Hurd Mill site on the Donagh Road, where Arda is clearing the site for a dam. Before, and after, the First Great War it was my favourite grouse hunting spot. I miss the native partridge and seldom did I miss getting a shot, or several shots, at rocketing ruffed grouse. The Southport farmer was a frequent companion on such trees. A cluster of wild apple trees was the attraction. Old Jack would move in and sometimes as many as a dozen big fluffy natives would thunder out the black powder shells in the in gauge. Doubles would speak in thunderous tones and sometimes one, on rare occasions two, would drop from the air. To be perfectly truthful, clean misses were a strong fifty per cent on such hunts. Old Jack would give with a sad look on such occasions but was all joy and tail wagging when we scored.

The old dam embankment, except for a lone apple tree near its end, looked very much like it did fifty odd years ago. But there all resemblance had vanished. Huge spruce had replaced the alder, willow and light hardwood growth. Power saws had left clean, white stumps almost at ground level, that were twelve to fourteen inches in diameter. Two bulldozers stood by as stump clearing and "fill" movers. They could move more "fill" in an hour than fifty hard-working men could move via the horse and cart method, in a month. Pick, shovel and sheer muscle was what made things move in the days when this dam was brought into being. Men were what the name implies in those days.

RAIN MILL
I talked to Roland MacDonaid a few days ago and he told me his grandfather run this mill at one time and the place buzzed with activity. This was my first visit to the Hurd Mill site since the early thirties approximately 33 years ago. As I stood on the embankment of the old dam nostalgic memories came crowding in. In my mind's eye I could see old Jack moving cautiously into the cluster of apple trees and vines and hear the thunderous take-off of the big "natives". In many ways those were good days when life was really worth living. One thing certain there were no nuclear bombs that could wipe this province off the map in a matter of minutes... or less.

We had great imaginations in those bygone days. Brother Art and I would squat before the fire in the Waterloo stove and watch the hardwood, blocks as the

sparks seemed to explode like pistol shots in the open front. We could see all sorts of animals and even Indians on the prowl. When a segment of a burning log would break away with a sharp crack and fly like a bullet across the open grate and hit something we thought looked like an Indian — Art would exclaim: "He got him". We had plenty of imagination in those days even if we were short in other essentials.

Life moves at a fast tempo in this age. Even elections have lost some of their old time glamour but most certainly none of their humour. The Old Souris Lighthouse is the center of attraction at the moment politically and otherwise and the area has lost none of its own style humour. They tell me that the slogan making headlines in our eastern metropolis is "If it moves pension it — if it doesn't pave it". Let somebody try and beat that one.

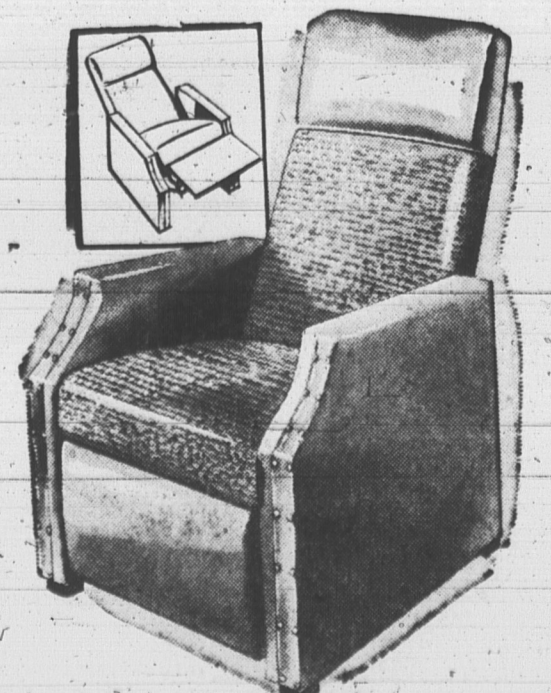

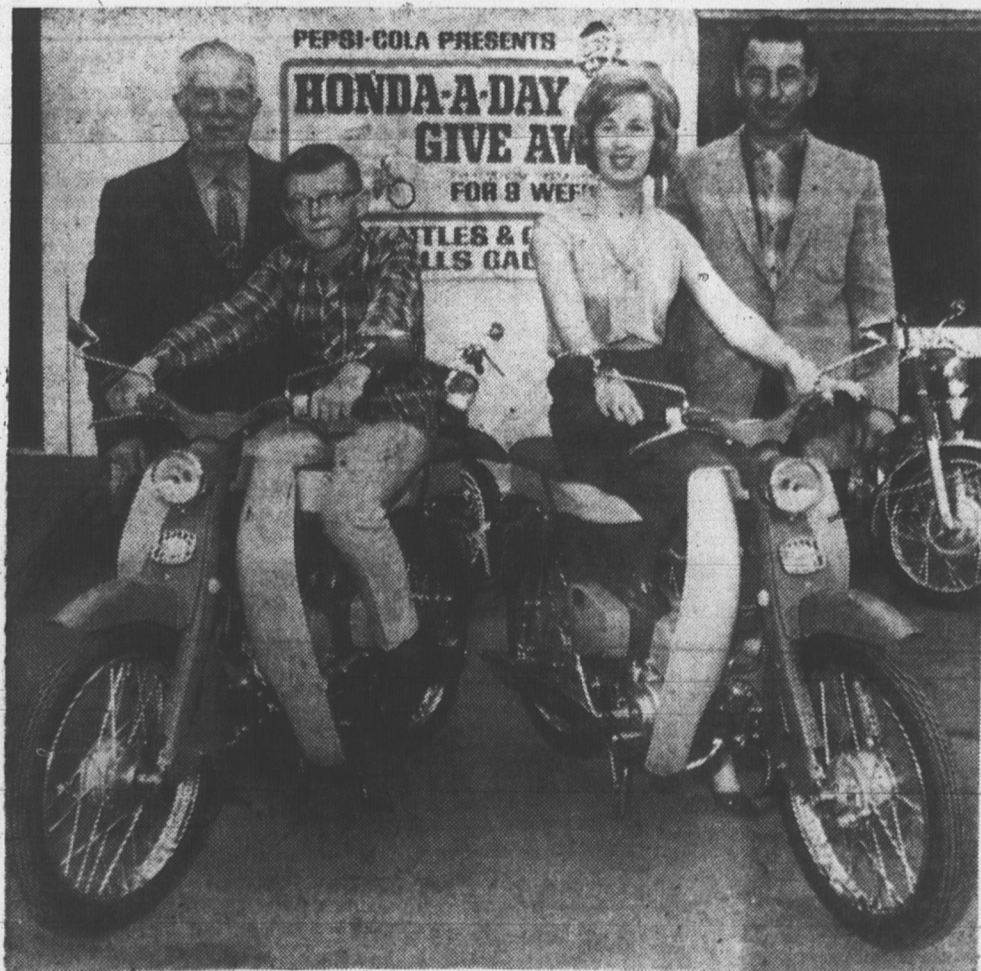
