

Ox-bye Daisy.

Peter Perley in the Boston Cultivator, gives interesting notes on this weed, which is spreading in Prince Edward Island, and is a pest to farmers in Charlottetown and St. John's.

Called in some localities "May-weed," it has spread all over the Northern States, crowding out the more valuable grasses, and successfully resisting all attempts to extirpate it. Occasionally the owner of a small, well tilled, and highly-manured farm has succeeded in subduing it; but too often the farmers set out on Crusades against white-weed which resemble the onslaught of Don Quixote on the wind-mill, and finally have to admit that "the pesky weed has gotten the better of them."

Perhaps, however, white-weed should not be universally execrated as entirely worthless, like burdock or thistles. Col. Colman used to say that he preferred a load of English hay of which from 100 to 200 pounds was white-weed to a load of hay which contained no white-weed. It was his theory that the bitter taste of the stalk gave a palatable flavor to the hay, and that the seed was nourishing. I am inclined to think that one reason why my own cattle, who receive no grain of any kind, will compare favorably with those which are crammed with meal and turnips, during the winter is that I have, unfortunately, more or less white-weed in all of my mowing land. The oil and the farina of the seeds render white-weed, if cut in the proper season, before it is too ripe, excellent food for cattle. Its great increase is doubtless owing to its blossoming early, and shedding its seed before the grass is mown. Though these seeds cannot vegetate in a rich and vigorous crop of grass, they remain ready to catch any vacancy, and, as other grasses decline, come in to supply their places. Dr. Deane, in his work entitled "New England Farming," published at the close of the last century, says of white-weed—"When it is in its green state neither neat cattle or horses will eat it, but if it is cut while in blossom and well dried for hay, the cattle will eat it freely in winter and live well on it. The crop, however, is always thin and light. If it is mowed late, or not well cured and preserved, the hay will be of little value."

Reams of paper and gallons of ink have been consumed in elaborate essays on the extermination of white-weed. Dr. Deane says:—"When this weed has got possession of the ground no good grass can grow with it, because the roots bind being a stronger feeder, it deprives other plants of their food. Clover, herds grass, and red-top are crowded out by it, and after it takes all the nourishment from the soil, little else will grow there." I have tried several times to lay a piece of land down to grass the which there would be no white-weed, but without success. Four years ago I planted the large area on the top of Indian Hill in corn for two successful years, using a lavish supply of fertilizers, but no manure. I hoped in this way that when I laid the land down to grass the white-weed would be banished. The land was thoroughly cultivated and in good heart when the grass seed was sown, but, to my disgust, the white blossom appeared this year so unnumberedly that it was useless to attempt their extirpation. It has been said that sheep, turned in on a lot where there was white-weed and giving nothing to eat, would eradicate it. Accounts have been given for experiments in this way which were eminently successful, but in my case the results was that the sheep were half starved and the white-weed not banished.

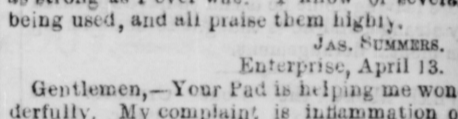
