

Patriots Defeat Buffalo Bills For First Place

 Boston Patriots defeated defending champion Buffalo Bills 14-3 Sunday to take over the American Football League's Eastern Division lead.

The victory left Boston with a 7-3-2 record, compared with Buffalo's 6-4-1. The Patriots need only two ties in the final two games with Houston Oilers and New York Jets to advance to the league - championship showdown with Kansas City Chiefs, the Western titlist. Buffalo, bidding for a third straight crown, dropped to second place with one game left.

New York and Oakland Raiders tied 20-20 Saturday, killing the Jets' hopes in the East with a 5-5-2 record. Oakland now is 7-4-1 in the West.

In Sunday's other two games, San Diego Chargers downed Houston Oilers 28-22 and Denver Broncos beat Miami Dolphins 17-7. San Diego now is 6-5-1 and Denver is 4-8 in the West in the East. Houston is 3-9 and Miami is 2-10.
