About Joan of Arc. M. Marcel Schwob has discovered in the Paris Bibliotheque Nationale a calendar of the cases in the criminal court, the Chambre de la Tournele, going back to the fifteenth century. Among the papers are the official notes of Joan of Arc's arrest and of her execution and a decree of the Paris parliament annulling the judgment by which the provost of Paris, Villiers de l'Isle Adam, condemned Francois Villon, the poet, to be hanged. The sentence is revoked, but the poet, "in consequence of his bad life," is banished from Paris and his neighborhood for ten years. He was charged with being concerned in a brawl in which a man was killed, but the court held the evidence against him to be insufficient. The date of the decree is Jan. 15, 1463, which clears up a good many disputed points about Villon.
