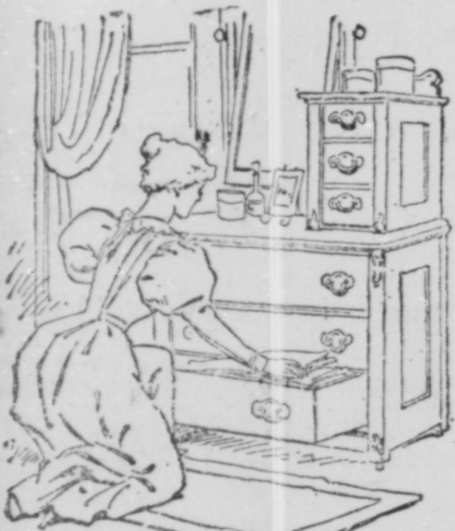

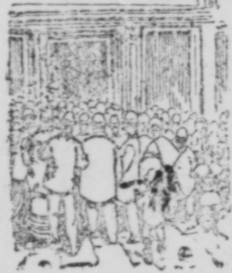

## NEWLY ISSUED MILITIA ORDER

### Makes a Number of Important Changes.

#### THE ARTILLERY REGIMENTS ARE TO BE DIVIDED

And a Number of Changes Made in the Different Corps.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, Dec. 3.—A militia general order just issued pays a tribute to the late Colonel Panet.

The age for cadets for the Royal Military College has been changed from 15 to 19 to over 16 years and under 20.

Correspondence to headquarters in the future must be addressed to the Chief of Staff Officer. For present Adjutant General Aylmer will act as Chief Staff Officer.

District Commanding Officer will in future include in their commands all permanent universities and schools of instruction within the area of their districts.

The R. R. Canadian Artillery is divided into field and garrison divisions and will be dealt with as distinct organizations.

A. and B. batteries will form the field artillery divisions and be commanded by Col. C. W. Drury.

Nos 1 and 2 companies will constitute garrison artillery division and be commanded by Col. J. F. Wilson.

A permanent remounts committee with Col. Drury as chairman has been appointed.

The regulation regarding the equitation course for mounted hussars is modified so that officers who are already good horsemen will not be compelled to take the course but will simply go up for examination.

The appointment of honorary colonels of corps hereafter will be reserved for special cases.

The distinction to be conferred upon individuals of high standing in the state or for honorable and faithful service to the country of exceptional nature.
