



# Yanks Stop Boston Surge With 3-2 Win; Redlegs Snap Cub Streak At Six Games

New York Yankees needed 13 innings Wednesday to stop the American League's rampaging Boston Red Sox 3-2 in a sensational pitching duel. Big Don Larsen was the winner over Frank Sullivan by virtue of Andy Carey's single over Ted Williams' head.

And over in the National League, Cincinnati Redlegs snapped a six-game Chicago Cub winning streak by downing the Bruins twice, 7-2 and 6-3. The wins pulled the Redlegs to within two games of the fifth-place Cubs.

Billy Klaus, Boston shortstop, fumbled Yogi Berra's roller, to give the Yanks their opening in the 13th. After Joe Collins sacrificed Berra to second, manager Pinky Higgins ordered Sullivan to walk Irv Noren. Hank Bauer broke his bat on a weak pop fly to Sullivan for the second out but Carey smashed a long liner to send Berra home. Neither team had scored since Boston pushed over two in the second and New York countered with two in the third.

## Man Plans To Swim Lake

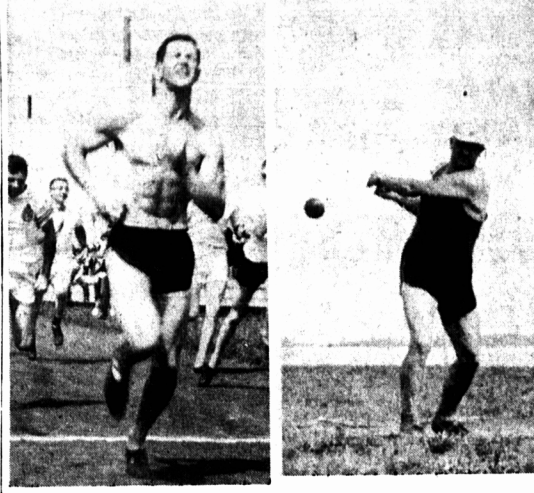
