

Royal Couple To Use 'Heron' Plane On Flight To New Glasgow

Much has been written about the two RCAF aircraft which have carried Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip on parts of their Canadian tour. They are the four engine C-5 and the Comet (jet). However, much less in the news is the type of aircraft which will fly the Royal Couple from Charlottetown to New Glasgow, N.S. It is the "Heron". The following information on the aircraft has been made available through F.L. E.A. Hibberd, RCAF Station, Summerside.

The DeHavilland Heron is a four engine monoplane developed from the earlier DeHavilland Dove. It is powered by four 250 horsepower DeHavilland Gypsy Queen six-cylinder air-cooled direct drive supercharged engines. The accommodation can be arranged so as to provide seating capacity for up to seventeen passengers. It has a wing span of 71 feet six inches, a fuselage length of 46 feet six inches, and a height of 14 feet two inches. The Heron has an all-up weight of 12,500 pounds. Maximum cruising speed is 177 miles per hour at 3000 feet. It has a still air range of 400 miles with 3420 pound payload, or 1250 miles with 1750 pound payload.
