

# Premier Joins S' Side Branch Can. Legion

An impressive initiation ceremony in which 39 new members, including Premier A. W. Matheson were accepted into the membership of the Summerside Branch of the Canadian Legion, was carried out last evening at the regular general meeting held in the home. President Ben Champion presided.

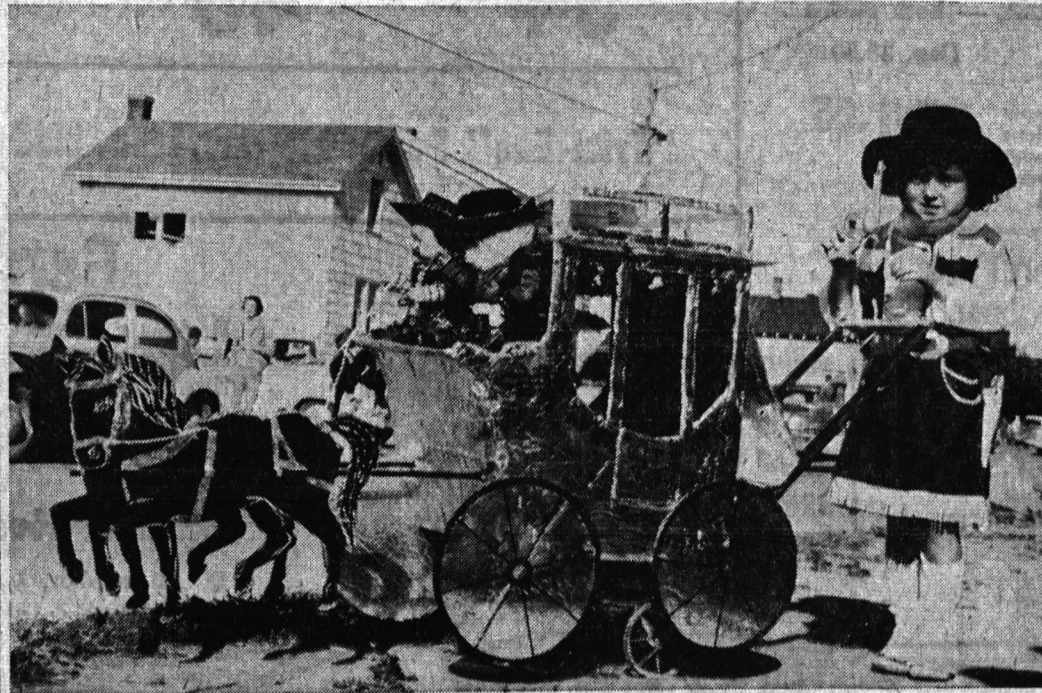

## Work Starts On Debris Removal

Under arrangements now pending with the town of Summerside and the Stedman Company approximately 14 feet will be purchased from Mrs. MacArthur by the town on Summer Street and an equal amount purchased from the Stedman people by Mrs. MacArthur.
