SET OFF TEST BLAST. WASHINGTON (AP)—A nuclear test blast—the 10th announced this year—was set off Thursday at the Atomic Energy Commission's Nevada test site. The AEC said the underground blast was of low yield, with a force less than that of 20,000 tons of TNT. In addition to the 10 weapon-related tests this year, the AEC has announced two other nuclear tests to develop peaceful uses for atomic explosives.

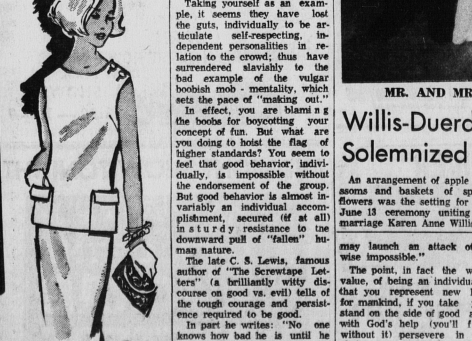
