## LORD ROBERTS COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF

### Yesterday was His Birthday ay.

#### COMPLETE ARMY REORGANIZATION.

The Scheme of the Government will be Announced this Evening.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER]

LONDON, Oct. 1.—It is officially announced that Lord Roberts has been appointed Commander in chief of the British Army. Yesterday was Lord Roberts' birthday.

LONDON, Oct. 1.—General Kitchener will probably remain as Lord Roberts' right-hand man, and General Buller will be Commander in Africa.

The announcement of Lord Roberts' appointment is the most startling event in British military affairs in half a century. Great changes are certain to take place in the British army system, and Lord Roberts being consummately a soldier will undoubtedly construct a powerful fighting organization out of the material given him.

LONDON, Oct. 1.—Although the fact that the appointment had been made was already known, the formal announcement is hailed by the Unionist party as a welcome pledge that the army reorganization will be carried out in the most effective manner. It was beginning to be recognized that something was needed to give strength to the Unionist campaign.

It is semi-officially announced that Mr. Wyndham, the parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for War, in his speech to be delivered at Derby this evening, will outline the government's scheme of army reforms, and that the War Office is arranging with Lord Roberts for the return of a large portion of the army in South Africa.

#### CANADIAN CONTINGENT

### Sailed For Home Yesterday—Cape Town Returns Thanks.

CAPE TOWN, Oct. 1.—The Canadian contingent, under Major Pelletier, sailed yesterday on board the transport Idaho. The people of Cape Town accorded them a reception, the Mayor voicing the thanks of the city for their brilliant services in the field.

#### Boxers Captured.

PEKIN, Sept. 21, via Shanghai, Sept. 27.—Many boxers have been captured in the city through information furnished by Christian and pro-foreign Chinese. The latter state that many boxers are entering the city in disguise. The boxers say they will bide their time, and will win yet. The population of the city is increasing steadily. The provost marshals' courts are administering the affairs of the city. The punishments inflicted on persons convicted of various offences range from death to fifty blows and hard labor. Boxers are executed.

#### Foreign Forces.

VIENNA, Sept. 29.—The Admiralty has received a despatch from Taku giving the strength of the forces landed there by the allied powers as follows:  
Austrian, 494; German, 8,178; British, 8,353; American, 5,608; French, 6,575; Italy, 2,541; Russia, 20,934; Japanese, 15,570; total, 68,253.

#### Injunction Served on Miss Coghlan.

ROCHESTER, Sept. 29.—United States Marshal Burns succeeded after the play here this evening of "Becky Sharp" or "Vanity Fair," in serving an injunction on Miss Gertrude Coghlan, restraining that actress from presenting "Becky Sharp" until October 5th, when she must appear at Syracuse and show cause why a permanent injunction shall not enter.

### Russia Withdraws From Peking

#### FRICITION BETWEEN BRITISH AND RUSSIANS.

Sections of Railway in the Hands of Both

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER]

PEKIN, Sept. 25, via Shanghai, Sept. 30.—At a conference of generals here today, the Russian commander announced the immediate withdrawal from Peking of the bulk of the Russian troops. He will leave on Sept. 27, and the Russian legation will follow on Saturday.

There will remain a mixed force of about 2,000 men to represent Russia.

The Russian general asserted that the despatch from St. Petersburg, transmitting the order to withdraw, contained a statement that all the powers were adopting the same policy.

The other generals replied that they had received no order of that nature.

Fricition between the British and Russians over the railway continues, each seizing and guarding small sections. The repairing of the line, is therefore, unsystematic, and the completion of work is very indefinite.

#### Coghlan's Body Found.

GALVESTON, Texas, Sept. 29.—A report reached here to-day that the casket containing the remains of Charles Coghlan, the actor, who died in this city last winter, was found at a point about sixteen miles north of Galveston, near the town of La Marque. The casket was washed from the receiving vault at Lakeview cemetery, which was destroyed by the storm. The undertaker who placed the casket in the vault went to La Marque this evening to identify it.
