FRANK PRUNTY
The death occurred at his home in Charlottetown on May 3, 1952, of Frank Prunty, one of Charlottetown's well known citizens.

Although he had not been in very good health for the past two years and had spent several periods in the Charlottetown Hospital, still, on his final return home, he seemed to be recuperating and his unexpected death came as a great shock to his family and many friends.

"Kruger", as he was familiarly known, was the son of the late Michael Prunty and Mary Ellen Chipman. He was a faithful employee of the City for forty-one years and was for many years a member of the City Fire Department and the Charlottetown Yacht Club. Being always willing to be of service to others, he was one of the senior ushers at St. Dunstan's Basilica and for many years presided over many of the Bingo parties held in the city.

The many tributes paid to him by people in all walks of life were an eloquent testimony of the esteem in which he was held by all as an honest, industrious, faithful and trustworthy employee. Being possessed of a genial personality he made many friends but it is in his family circle that he will be especially missed as a kind and loving husband and father.

He was twice married. Of his first marriage with the late Margaret Hetheridge he is survived by three children, Jean, Mrs. Hugh MacKinnon, Mary, Mrs. Edward MacKinnon, and William. Of his marriage with Miss Agatha Trainor of Hope River he is survived by one son Patrick. He is also survived by a sister Mary, Mrs. Earl Stanley, City, 2 brothers Owen, City and Patrick Dorchester, Mass.

His funeral was held from the Charlottetown Funeral Home to St. Dunstan's Basilica where Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. Walter Reid. Louis Dooley assisted in the sanctuary. Attending the funeral in a body were members of the city council, the City Fire Department, the City employees, the ushers of St. Dunstan's Basilica and the teachers and staff of Grades three and four of Queen Square School.

The pall bearers were J.A. Fullerton, Russell Abbott, Ralph Crockett, Austin Bradley, Frank Gallant and William Fynn. The large number who accompanied his remains to their final resting place in the Roman Catholic cemetery was another fitting tribute to the high esteem in which he was held by all.
