Wright-Hargreaves Financial Report

TORONTO, Oct. 23 — (CP) — Wright-Hargreaves Mines, Ltd. reported net profit in the year ending Aug. 31 of \$743,717, compared with \$921,076 in the preceding year. Proceeds from bullion in the year totalled \$2,915,703, and operating costs were \$2,355,731, leaving operating profit of \$559,972. Estimated credits under the emergency gold mining assistance Act, including adjustments for 1949 and 1950, were \$112,075. Interest and sundry income was \$71,009. Current assets at fiscal year-end were \$1,211,169, and current liabilities \$439,822, indicating working capital of \$771,347, a decrease of \$230,192 from the preceding year. Wright-Hargreaves has a producing gold mine at Kirkland Lake, Ont.

Savings Bonds Sales Increase

OTTAWA, Oct. 23 — (CP) — The Bank of Canada today reported \$67,500,000 worth of Canadian savings bond sales during the first week of the current campaign. Sales, increasing 21 per cent from the \$55,700,000 in the first week of last year's campaign, went to 200,000 buyers, up four per cent from the 200,600 buyers in the same period last year. More than 100 companies have already surpassed their final 1950 total sales, the bank said. So far, not one company has reported a decline from their 1950 total.
