### New P.E.I. Gov't Bldg. To Start Next Spring

Two of the first steps to be taken by the Crown building corporation formed by the government to handle construction of the new provincial building, will be the appointment of an architect and the setting up of a board of assessors.

Provincial Secretary J. David Stewart said yesterday that construction of the building will likely start next spring. At the last session of the Legislature, Mr. Stewart said it was hoped that construction would start in the fall.

Recently, the government's Executive Council approved the West Kent School block, bounded by Richmond, Kent, Fitzroy and West Streets, as the site for the building. It is expected that the City of Charlottetown will deed to the corporation a portion of land it owns in the block — the school site.

**POWER "TO DEAL"**

The board of assessors, expected to be appointed at a meeting of the corporation directors next week, will have the power to make deals with the other property owners in the block on the sale of private land which will be incorporated into the building site.

"At the moment," said Mr. Stewart, "we are only interested in the purchase of private properties in the area so that court action will not be necessary."

The legislation under which the building corporation was set up, gives the corporation power to expropriate land for building purposes.

**ARMORIES SITE**

Mr. Stewart said that it will be some time before more space on the general site of the building is needed, and that the land on which the Charlottetown Armouries is situated will be available over when it becomes available. This may be several years.

Names of the members of the building corporation will probably be made public early next week. Mr. Stewart said that several of those appointed to the board by the Executive Council Thursday wanted several days to think it over before deciding to serve with the corporation.

### Recapitalization Of CNR Debt Is Considered

OTTAWA (CP) — Recapitalization of the Canadian National Railways' huge accumulation of fixed debt charges is under "very intensive study," Finance Minister Fleming said here.

Discussions have been held with the publicly-owned railway for some time and the result will be submitted to Parliament in due course, he told the Commons in reply to questions by former Liberal transport minister Lionel Chevrier.

But he said it would be premature until the talks are concluded to say what the government has in mind.

Mr. Chevrier, MP for Montreal Laurier, recalled that the CNR, through its formation from a group of bankrupt private lines in the 1920s, was saddled with big fixed charges that impeded its successful financial operation.

He noted the deficit for the 1961 calendar year was about \$67,000,000 and obtained figures from Mr. Fleming which showed the proportion of costs for inherited debt.

In 1960, net railway income to go toward these costs was \$100,000,000.

\$6,479,000 and the total fixed charges were \$95,000,000.

In 1961, net rail revenue that could be paid on the fixed debt had increased to \$72,987,000.

In each case, Mr. Fleming said, sums from Trans-Canada Air Lines had reduced these figures.

Mr. Fleming also told Mr. Chevrier that the CNR drew a total of \$65,700,000 in federal subsidies in 1961 under various categories. The largest was \$27,800,000 to a total \$90,000,000 allocated to Canadian railways as an interim measure pending implementation of the recommendations of the royal commission on transportation.

### Prince Philip Has Advice For British Industrialists

LONDON (CP) — A sun-drenched Prince Philip, just back from a 60-day tour of South America, handed some blunt advice to Britain's industrialists.

Speaking to the grand council of the Federation of British Industries, which represents most of the nation's manufacturers, he said:

"I'm sorry to say this, but there is no getting away from it. At the moment we have a

reputation for being rather slow and old-fashioned."

His speech, followed by a question-and-answer session, was heard by some 200 council members, representatives of trade and export organizations and journalists.

"They do think we have rather abandoned them," he said when asked if South Americans thought the British were lagging behind continental countries.

He followed this quickly with a quip.

**MADE EXCUSES**

"I spent all my time excusing this by saying we had spent all our money on the Commonwealth."

After the session the prince flew to Frankfurt with his 13-year-old son, Prince Charles, for a visit with relatives in West Germany.
