

British Gov't Is Reported Cutting Down On Immigrants

ONDON (Reuters)—The Labour government is currently selling Commonwealth countries that less than 10,000 immigrants a year will be allowed into Britain under a new policy agreed by the cabinet, well-informed sources said here.

Most of the estimated 1,000,000 Commonwealth immigrants already in Britain are from India, Pakistan and the West Indies.

The sources said the government's decision to restrict the level of this immigration without halting it, was being circulated to Commonwealth governments in advance of a formal statement to Parliament, expected toward the end of this month.

Good Luck Alberta Town Is Reported Disappearing

LANGDON, Alta. (CP)—Langdon, the town where nobody died during its first 25 years' existence, is dying itself. Its stores are disappearing, its school is closed, its hotel has long been torn down.

From 1883 until 1908 the expanding railway point was known as a "good luck town." Then a typhoid epidemic struck and the first graves were dug at Langdon, 17 miles southeast of Calgary.

Four years later, contemporary accounts relate, the Langdon boom was over. The Model T Ford arrived and the day-long ride to Calgary was cut to a matter of minutes. Families began to move away.

Langdon's school closed in 1962. A year later, one of the two remaining stores closed. Grain shipments last year totalled 235,000 bushels, a quarter of what they used to be. By April, the popgo. was 73.

R. B. Langdon, sub-contractor for the Canadian Pacific Railway, was one of two men to turn the first sod here in 1882. A year later, a CPR station was set up in a boxcar and named after him.

The first recorded account of the town appeared in the 1884 edition of Henderson's Gazette and directory of the northwest. It read:

"Langdon—on the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway 819 miles west of Winnipeg, has a telegraph office, mail tri-
