Local and Other Items.

DON'T MISS THEM.—The Montreal Weekly Star and the WEEKLY EXAMINER both papers from now until the end of the year for 20 cents.

INSTANTLY KILLED.—Joseph McLaughlin, of Bible Hill, Truro, was instantly killed by being caught in the flywheel of a thrashing machine on the 26th ult.

DAMAGED BY HAIL.—A terrible hail storm came down upon Niagara Falls, N Y, at 4 o'clock on the afternoon of Monday last. In the north end of the city glass in almost every building, public and private was broken. The loss will be large.

ANOTHER CAPTURE.—Last week the Stanley captured a sixty-ton schooner which was making the port of St. Mary's Guysboro county, from St. Pierre, with her hold filled to the hatches with a cargo of goods upon which the Canadian revenue laws imposed heavy duties.
