RAIL CLERK MAKES MILLION

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP)—How a modest railway clerk made \$1,700,000 came to light here when an inventory was filed in court by the First Trust Company of St. Paul.

Henry R. Grochau was 90 when he died last Dec. 26. His total was listed at \$1,681,694.

Grochau, who served 32 years with Chicago and North Western Railroad, in 1902 bought 371 shares of Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Company stock at \$1 a share. In 1929, he bought 25 more shares at \$11.25 a share.

At the time of his death, Grochau's investment was at a rate of nearly \$84 a share, and due to numerous stock splits over the years, he held 27,246 shares. Current dividend rate is \$1 a share annually.

Expansion Plans Made By Domtar

MONTREAL (CP)—Dominion Tar and Chemical Co. Ltd. announced here an \$85,000,000 expansion program for its Quebec and Ontario pulp and paper operations.

Biggest segment of the expenditure will be a \$62,000,000 pulp and paper operation at Lac Quevillon, five some 200 miles northwest of Ottawa in the Abitibi district.

The Lac Quevillon mill will produce 850 tons of pulp a day and will employ about 2,000.

W. N. Hall, president of Domtar, said at a press conference that construction of the mill has been decided "subject to satisfactory conclusion of final arrangements."

While Mr. Hall would not comment, these "final arrangements" were understood to be an eventual report by a Quebec royal commission favoring the seven-day week in the pulp and paper industry.

The royal commission was appointed recently by the Quebec government and is expected to begin public hearings in November.

"We are still going ahead without any attention being paid to these final arrangements," Mr. Hall said. "The design of the mill already is well advanced."

Mr. Hall also said the company will completely modernize its kraft pulp facilities at Windsor, Que., and will install an additional new fine paper machine at its Cornwall, Ont., mill.

Some \$11,000,000 will be spent at Cornwall, centred on the installation of the new fine paper machine, the plant's seventh. The project also involves a large extension of the paper finishing and shipping departments and expansion of the stock preparation system.

Library Ass'n Names Officers

HALIFAX (CP)—Eugene Gattiner of Memorial University in St. John's, Nfld., has been elected president of the Atlantic Provinces Library Association.

Other officers elected for the next term include vice-presidents Douglas Boylan of the Prince Edward Island Legislative Library; Jean-Guy Desroches of Central Library Services, Fredericton; Marjorie Meves of Goring Memorial Library, St. John's and Sylvia Fullerton of Dalhousie University Science Library, Halifax.

Outgoing president Kathleen Currie of Halifax told the association's annual session Monday that while library facilities in the region are expanding rapidly, the number of trained personnel available does not keep pace with the development.

Hardwood Seen In Short Supply

TORONTO (CP)—Hardwood lots, including stands of maple trees, are rapidly being depleted in Canada, experts at the annual meeting of the Canadian Institute of Forestry report.

The hardwood stands are mostly on private property in Ontario and Quebec. David J. Love, professor of forestry at the University of Toronto said Monday: "The problem of getting sustained growth on these lots is increasing."

"If hardwood stands are harvested on a partial-cut basis the lot's rate of recovery is equal to that of coniferous woods. But too often this is not done."

On the brighter side—for the maple tree—Lloyd D. Hawboldt, of the Nova Scotia department of lands and forests, said: "The sugar bush will become something more of a cultivated orchard than a wild stand. This will promote tree-breeding and grafting to take advantage of those trees which consistently give greater flows of sap with higher sugar content."

CITY SURVIVES
