(Continued from page 2) The accused for a year and a half. The day he delivered the 196 bags of potatoes he said was the first time he had gone down into the basement. Previous deliveries had been made to the main floor section.

Five more defence witnesses were examined during the afternoon session, before the case was adjourned until 2:30 Friday afternoon.

The first—Elizabeth Reid, a sister of the accused who is employed in his restaurant, testified that a farmer Borden Ford delivered 16 bags of potatoes to the business establishment on the evening of Dec. 3, 1958. She told him to put them down in the cellar and gave him a slip for them in receipt.

NO KNOWLEDGE Witness said she didn't have any knowledge as to the exact location of the potato storage in the basement.

Questioned Miss Reid said that she had seen no other person delivering potatoes to the restaurant on that night, neither did she see the accused in the building.

Under cross-examination, the witness said that she hadn't seen the potatoes taken into the cellar, but that her brother-in-law had gone down to watch them being brought in and dumped.

A Harrington farmer, George MacKay, testified that he had known the accused for 10 or 12 years and during that time had conducted potato business with him on several occasions.

The witness said that he visited Reid's restaurant in November of last year and at that time had been in the basement and saw a large pile of potatoes which he would estimate to contain from 150 to 170 bags.

Any time that he had made deliveries MacKay said that he had always put them down into the basement through a window on the north side of the building.

Cross-examined, he said that during 1958 he had delivered 65 75-pound bags of potatoes to Reid's, this was in the spring of the year.

G'town Is Seen As Likely Point

GEORGETOWN — This little Kings County town will likely be the Island's operational point of APEC's new shipping service to the northland, Dr. Frank MacKinnon, president of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council, said yesterday.

Georgetown will probably be chosen, Dr. MacKinnon pointed out, because it is in direct line with the Strait of Canso and time is an important factor in the service which is due to get underway June 15.

The service will start at Saint John if 150 tons of produce are available. If not, Halifax will likely be the starting point. Some 50 tons of cargo is expected from the Island on the first voyage.

Dr. MacKinnon said three steamship companies have approached him with offers to participate in the service since the official announcement of its inauguration was made.

However, the chief aim this season, the council president said, was to firmly establish business with the north with one boat. A second or third could be added if business warrants it.
