BROOKWOOD, England (Reuters) — Maj. Dick Hampton of Toronto, a veteran marksman who has been coming to Bisley at regular intervals since the end of the war, missed a silver medal for top score in the Queen's Prize semi-final by a single point Friday.

It appeared for a few hours that Major Hampton's score of 145 out of a possible 150 was good enough for a tie at the top with J. S. Spaight of England. But when the last of the 300 marksmen finished their day's work, R. J. Cade of North London Rifle Club proved to have a 146 score and he took the silver medal.

Sandy Gilchrist Sets Swim Record

HAMILTON (CP) — British Columbia swimmers continued their barrage on the record book Friday at the Canadian amateur swimming championships and British Empire Games trials.

Sandy Gilchrist, a native of Ocean Falls, B.C., attending the University of Southern California at Los Angeles, cracked the Canadian native and open record in the men's 220-yard individual medley with a heat time of 2:21.1.

The former native record of 2:25.4 was set by Aldy Meinhardt of Vancouver in 1964 while the open mark, also set in 1964, was 2:24.7 by Ted Leovitch of Tacoma, Wash.

It was the seventh record to fall at the meet, which ends at the McMaster University pool today with the announcement of the Canadian swimming and diving team going to the British Empire Games in Kingston, Jamaica, next month. Two of the records belong to Gilchrist.

Wednesday, he set a Canadian native and open mark in the 220-yard freestyle with a time of 2:02.1.

"I was out to break the record in case I didn't do it tonight," he said after shattering the individual medley mark. He finished 8.9 seconds ahead of second-place Bob Krull of Winnipeg.

SPORT-HOMENUIK — WILKINGSTON, Ont. (CP) — Wulf Homenuik of Winnipeg Friday matched his opening round 68 to take the 36-hole lead with the 136 in the 54-hole Ontario Open at Catarauqui Golf and Country Club.

Moe Norman of Gifford, Ont., went one over par with a 71 to fall one stroke behind Homenuik with 137. He was the first day leader with a four-under-par 66.

Lambton's Doug Mossop is the low amateur, tied for third with Bob Panasiuk, the 24-year-old pro from Windsor Hydeaway. Mossop was even par 70 both days for 140. Panasiuk shot a two-under-par 68 Friday to go with his first-round 72.

Tied for fourth with 141 are two amateurs, Nick Westlock, the 47-year-old six-time Open champion from Burlington, and Ernie Bentley of Toronto.

Homenuik played steady golf Friday, carding a pair of birdies and paring the rest of the way. He stubbed his putter on a three-foot putt on the 16th, championship and British Empire Games trials.
