

Navy Recruiting Team To Visit Province

The Navy Recruiting team is returning to P. E. I. again, and will recruit in Georgetown on Nov. 15, Montague on Nov. 16 and 17, and Cardigan on Nov. 18. Visits to these towns were scheduled for last October, but had to be postponed then and rescheduled as above. This time the Navy is recruiting for practically all its 50 ranches, but are particularly interested in recruiting for the engineering, communications and seamen branches.

Lt. Cdr. R. G. Cunnell, Area Recruiting Officer for the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland states that a large number of young men, age 16 to 18, are taking advantage of the Apprentice Bandsman Plan. Apprentices enroll for 7 years and at the end of their apprenticeship are fully qualified musicians. Applicants of course must be interested in music as a career. Ability to play a band instrument is

useful but not essential. Applications are also being received for technical apprentices in the trades of engineering artificers, electrical technicians, radio technicians and shipwrights. The Navy Recruiting Team will be in charge of Lieutenant (E) L. W. Smith, Lt. Smith is well known in P.E.I., having visited the Island on two previous occasions. After recruiting in the Montague district, the unit will move to Summerside, where its office will be located in the Canadian Legion from Nov. 12 to Nov. 24.

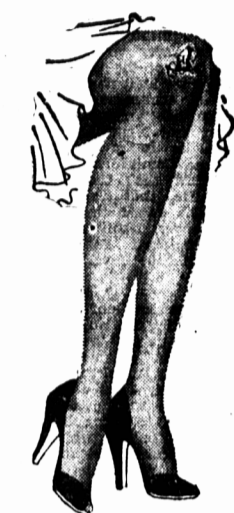
