U.S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP)—Orders for fourth-quarter delivery of steel are falling off somewhat, "Steel" the metal-working weekly noted Sunday but that doesn't necessarily forecast a sharp cut in steel consumption.

The magazine suggested some consumers might be holding off on orders because of steel's greater availability now than during fourth quarters of recent years.

It listed five factors that might influence steel consumers:

"1. The war emergency has faded away.

"2. Steel producing capacity has increased.

"3. Demand that accumulated for goods during the Second World War and the Korean War has been satisfied.

"4. The end of the Korean war inspired an increase in caution among business men.

"5. The 'pipelines' of steel distribution are filling up."

At one time, "Steel" said, it was normal for steel producers to receive orders only a short time before delivery.

The weekly said producers of steel plates and structural shapes for the construction trade "have comfortable backlogs of orders, the exceptions being mainly among the smaller shops... where competition for business is keenest."

But wire, it said, continues in easy supply as it has for some time, and pig iron demand, which has been lagging, may slip further as a result of a recent General Motors fire at Livonia, Mich.

Producers of tin plate also are experiencing a lull.

"Steel" reported that output for ingots and castings during the week ended Aug. 22 held steady at 96 per cent of rated capacity.

were the upheaval in Iran, the crippling strikes in France, the Korean debates in the United Nations, and the freshly-voiced predictions of curtailed steel demand.

Price weakness in the stock market was concentrated in the first three days. Monday's market was moderately lower with trading volume under 1,000,000 shares. Tuesday the selling accelerated beyond that and the market was down rather sharply.

The slide continued Wednesday at a much faster pace. Late in the day a recovery erased a good part of the early losses. As it turned out, that buoyancy carried through into Thursday when the market steadied and managed a small advance on light volume. That state of affairs continued through Friday.

The five most active issues last week on the New York stock exchange were New York Central off 7-8, American Telephone off 1-2, U. S. Steel off 3-8, Baltimore and Ohio off 3-4 and Atlantic Refining off 1-8.

The five most active issues week on the American stock exchange were Wilrich Petroleum unchanged, Webb and Knapp off 1-16, American Manganese off 3-8, Goldfield Consolidated unchanged, and Preston East Dome Mines up 5-16.

Canadian issues ended the trading week at New York on a mixture of slight changes up and down. Distillers Seagrams was up 3-8 and Dome Mines 1-8 while McIntyre slipped 3-4 and Hiram Walker 1-8.

Canadian issues on the American exchange were also mixed. Giant Yellowknife was up 1-8 in Friday's trading but Royalite Oil was off 1-4.

New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market slipped into a steep fall last week.

The break was not extensive but it was the worst since the declines that sent the market to the lowest point of the year early in June.

Virtually all sections of the market participated in the decline. Exceptions were the utilities and what are known in Wall Street as defensive issues.

What Wall Street is on the defensive about is a readjustment of business expected late this year and next year. What form this readjustment will take depends upon individual evaluation of economic factors.

Among the more optimistic in Wall Street, the fall in the market this week was regarded as a consolidated phase or a pause until the upswing is resumed. But there are those who take the gloomy view and hold the hope that the market doesn't collapse to a new low for the year.
