OTTAWA, Nov. 8 - (CP) - Anthony Eden, Deputy British Conservative Leader, paid a courtesy call on Prime Minister St. Laurent today and told reporters only that they discussed the international situation.

C.N.R. Places Large Order For Diesel Engines

MONTREAL, Nov. 12 - The largest order ever given by the Canadian National Railways for diesel-electric motive power was announced here by E. A. Bromley, vice president purchases and supplies.

Bringing the total cost of new equipment ordered by the railway in 1950 to about \$57,500,000, the new purchase consists of 40 road freight locomotives that are to be built by the Montreal Locomotive Works and General Motors Diesel Ltd. for delivery early in next year.

The 28 units of the new order from General Motors Diesel will be of 1,500 horsepower and almost identical to the six original road diesels of the C. N. R. which were built by the same company and placed in the Montreal-Toronto freight service two years ago. However, they will be equipped with an automatic gear shift to replace the manual control and changes have been made to the electric system to give them a greater hauling capacity. They will be equally divided between "A" units, which are the lead units with engines in cabin, and "B" or booster units.

The 12 to be built by Montreal Locomotive Works will be six "A" and six "B" units of 1600 horsepower each. They are similar to a previous order for eight placed in September and those now operating on C.N.R. lines between Montreal and Jonquiere, Que.

TOKYO, Nov. 12 - (AP) - The Korean war to date has caused property losses to 1,500,000 South Koreans and has destroyed more than 150,000 homes, Brig.-Gen. Crawford F. Sams of the United States reported Saturday.

Britain May Ease Trade Restrictions

LONDON, Nov. 12 - (Reuters) - Sir Cecil Weir, chairman of the British Dollar Exports Board, has announced that United Kingdom restrictions on dollar trade with Canada might be further eased.

"Some of these relaxations have already been made," he told Reuters in an interview. "But it is the hope of my Board that some easements over a wider field may now be justified."

Sir Cecil Weir was commenting on a speech in Ottawa yesterday by Trade Minister C. D. Howe of Canada in which he criticized Britain's restrictions on dollar trade and urged increased British purchases in Canada.

"My present opinion," Sir Cecil continued, "is that we can afford to take a few risks as an encouragement to, and an earnest indication of, our aim."

"That aim is to develop trade between Britain and Canada, not merely on the basis of balancing accounts, but to do so at the highest possible level of two-way trade."
