Lack Of Direction Appeared In N.Y. Market Last Week

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market backed away irregularly last week, appearing to lack any motive either for a continued advance or a sharp retreat.
The Dow Jones Industrial average ended the week with a loss of 4.54 at 895.79—a minor change.
Volume remained at a nominal 26,674,970 shares compared with 27,789,990 the week before.
It was a hesitant week and part of the hesitancy was due to another big offering of stock. This was a huge secondary offering of 2,815,106 shares of General Motors—a \$284,000,000 transaction—which sopped up a considerable amount of investment money and tended to remove some of the steam from the exchanges. In the previous week, Wall Street had to reckon with the big offering of General Aniline and filip-stock.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks last week declined 1.2 to 334.9. This followed a slight advance in the previous week.
The minor movements seemed to betoken a consolidating market.
As trading began last week, the Dow Jones industrial average was above the significant 900 line and prices were fairly strong. It appeared the market was making a drive to surpass the historic closing peak of 906.30 made earlier this year. But before Monday was over, prices were heading lower as profits were taken.
