WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands prorogued until Thursday, the Sixth day of December inst:

I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until Tuesday the Eighth day of January next, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
