

### Visit To Frozen Food Plant Is Scheduled

A feature of the visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and His Royal Highness Prince Philip to Prince Edward Island will be an inspection of the province's first agricultural freezing plant, established here in June of last year.

The plant is operated by the Heehey Frosted Foods Ltd., La-Prairie, P.Q.

On arrival at the frozen food plant at Sherwood the Royal Party will be met by the Hon. Eugene Cullen, minister of agriculture, and Mrs. Cullen; W. H. Heehey, president of the Prince Edward Island Frosted Foods Limited; and Mrs. Heehey; Leslie Palmer, vice-president, and Mrs. Palmer; R.J. Hetherington plant manager, and Mrs. Hether-

ington, and George Wright, assistant plant manager and Mrs. Wright.

**YEARS OF PLANNING**

The Island government, through the Industrial Development Board co-operated in seeing the processing plant constructed after some years of planning for the project. The Department of Agriculture lent full support in making field tests of the crops which were to be processed.

The construction of the plant was started in May 1957. Situated at Sherwood, a short distance from the Brackley Point Road, it is fully equipped for automatic operation.

**THREE TONS HOURLY**

From the time the products ar-

rive at the plant until they are fully frozen takes about an hour. A new type of plate freezer, the largest of its kind, handles three tons an hour. Products picked during the day are processed the same day.

About 50 people are normally employed to operate the plant, but at peak seasons the number may go as high as 100.

Products processed include, berries, peas and beans.

The Royal party is scheduled to arrive at the plant at 11 a.m. on Thursday and to leave it 11.30 a.m. The party's next point of call is the farm of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Prowse. Arrival is scheduled for 11:35 a.m.
