Portuguese, Indians Exchange Gunfire

BOMBAY, (AP) — Portuguese troops and Indian police exchanged gunfire last night on the border of Goa, capital colony of Portuguese India, reports reaching here said Wednesday. These reports said the clash occurred near the border town of Majali when members of the Hindu extremist Jan Sangh party tried to enter Goa, 250 miles south of Bombay. Don't Want Court Ruling On Pensions Appeals

TORONTO (CP)—The Canadian Legion has decided it does not want the courts to rule on appeals by veterans seeking disability pensions.

The Legion convention Wednesday, by an almost unanimous vote, rejected a resolution by Prince Edward Island delegates asking for appeals to the Exchequer Court from decisions of the Canadian Pension Commission.

O. F. Howe of Ottawa, the Legion's honorary solicitor, said the Commission now has great latitude in awarding pensions. "We don't want a strict court interpretation of pension decisions," he said.

E. B. Titus of Toronto, head of the Legion's tuberculous veterans section, said the proposal would mean "selling the veterans down the river."

When court appeals were permitted in the 1930s, he said, veterans won only about 1 1/2 per cent of their cases, while the Crown won more than half of its appeals against pension commission decisions.

Says Canada Tipped Off On Russian Plans

TORONTO (CP)—The Telegram says that recent changes ordered in the design of minesweepers under construction were the result of "secret data obtained about Russian latest developments in magnetic and acoustic mines."

In a dispatch from Ottawa the newspaper says Wednesday: "No hint was given as to how Canada was 'tipped off' to these latest developments behind the Iron Curtain."

"Behind those design changes, however, undoubtedly lies a story of espionage and undercover work at the top-secret level that embraces the free nations of the west."

"Although the manner in which Canadian naval authorities obtained details of the Soviet mines remains a well-kept secret, it is suggested that the Western nations can be as successful in espionage activities as the Russians."

Freighters Ground In St. Lawrence

MORRISBURG, Ont. (CP)—Two small freighters ran aground in heavy fog in the St. Lawrence river here Thursday but were not seriously damaged.

The Selkirk, owned by Canada Steamship Lines, and the Scottish motor vessel Dundee grounded within 500 yards of each other after negotiating the swift Du Plat rapids. No one was reported injured.

Two tugs from Kingston, Ont., were sent to free the grounded vessels. Both vessels were bound downriver when they ran aground. The Selkirk is carrying a cargo of grain and the Dundee deck cargo of automobiles and trucks and a package cargo in the hold.

Notes High Quality Of Jersey Entries

The bluebloods of the livestock world are gathered in the cattle barns at the Provincial Exhibition grounds this week. There are very heavy entry lists and some of the breeds will come to the Colosseum's judging ring in record numbers. Present indications are that the Jerseys will top the list in numbers. They were talking of more than 180 entries yesterday. Holsteins appeared to be running second with something over 160 head.

The Jerseys have quality as well as quantity. Veteran breeder and showman Edison B. Mutch of North River says the quality is the best in years.

Mr. Mutch, as usual, has a large entry list. The top attraction in his Rivernorth herd is the grand champion bull at the 1953 Royal Winter Fair. He is Edgelea Beacon Jester's Standard. Mr. Mutch saw the young calf in the barn of Alf Bagg in Edgelea Ontario. He bought him and brought him to this province. Last fall he took the calf back and won the top prize at the Royal against the cream of Canada's Jerseys.

The previous year Mr. Mutch had won the grand championship ribbon at the Royal with Jester's Standard Dreamer, a bull he bred on his own farm. It looks now as though he is after yet another championship at Canada's greatest fair. In his show herd today is a young male calf. The calf was bred artificially and Mr. Mutch paid \$500 for the semen. Veteran breeders at the fair suggested it was a record in itself for this Province.

The veteran showman admits that it was a big price but he regards his calf as one of the best bred animals ever to be dropped in the Province. His mother is Rivernorth Jester's Darling and her mother, Jester's Maid, was a full sister to the animal most Island Jerseymen knew as 'The Old Jester.' His full name was Brampton Jester's Standard 2nd.

His paternal granddam, Belle Beacon, is regarded as one of the outstanding cows on the continent. She has several records of more than one thousand pounds of fat and one of them over 1000 pounds. She has a daughter that has produced more than 950 pounds. The youngster's paternal granddair is Bellemont Royal. The semen was purchased from the Don Hea d farm at Richmond Hill, Ontario.
