ditions based on the answers to its questions: 1. Metalworking will sell 4.4 per cent more dollars worth of goods in 1958's second half than in the first. 2. Total 1958 dollar volume will be only 5.6 per cent less than that of record 1957.

The trade publication says, however, plant managers expect a relapse in net profits after taxes in the second half. The drop could amount to 8.6 per cent, Steel said.

After eight straight weeks of improvement, steelmaking operations fell 1.5 points last week to 63 per cent of capacity. Production was about 1,700,000 net tons of steel for ingots and castings. June's total output was about 7,300,000 tons, highest of any month this year.
