## Pearson Will Be Fifth Liberal PM

OTTAWA (CP) — Lester B. Pearson, 57-year-old former career diplomat, will be only the Canada since Confederation in 1867. There have been nine Conservative prime ministers.

The other Liberal prime ministers were: Alexander Mackenzie, Nov. 7, 1873, to Oct. 16, 1878; Sir Wilfrid Laurier, July 11, 1896, to Oct. 6, 1911; Rt. Hon. Mackenzie King, Dec. 29, 1921, to June 28, 1926; Oct. 25, 1926, to June 21, 1927; Oct. 23, 1923, to Nov. 15, 1948; Rt. Hon. Louis St. Laurent Nov. 15, 1948, to June 21, 1957.

The Conservative prime ministers were Sir John A. Macdonald 1867-73 and 1878-91; Sir John J. Abbott 1891-92; Sir John Thompson 1892-94; Sir Mackenzie Bowell 1894-96; Sir Charles Tupper 1896-1901; Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen 1901-1902; Sir Robert Borden 1902-1911; Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen 1911-1912; Rt. Hon. B. Bennett 1930-35; Rt. Hon. John G. Diefenbaker 1957-63.

## New Restrictions Threaten On U.S. Tourist Spending

WASHINGTON CP — Canadian authorities have protested against a proposed U.S. proposal which would impose further restrictions on U.S. tourists visiting the United States and other countries, it was learned here.

The latest proposal is to allow the duty-free allowance on tourists goods which do not accompany the traveler on his return to the U.S.

The treasury department has issued confidential message to congressional ways and means committee asking for a \$100 million ceiling of \$100 worth of tourist goods which can be brought back by the tourist.

In addition, the department asked for legislation to reduce the duty-free privilege to goods which accompany the tourist and not to goods which he may buy on his travels and have shipped to his home later.

Department officials said the "ship later" privilege resulted in many abuses.

U.S. tourists visiting one country only under goods in another country and have been shipped to the U.S., claiming the \$100 duty-free which can be exercised every 30 days on trips of 48 hours or more.

HURT CANADIAN SHOPS  
Canadian authorities, in a protest of the department's proposal, told the U.S. government that such a restriction would hurt a lot of Canadian shops which cater to U.S. tourists. These shops in many cases built up their trade on the basis that they sell their products to the tourist's home in the U.S. and so reduce the financial burden for the traveler.

One Canadian official said it would be a serious restriction but it might be substantial in some individual cases.

The present U.S. duty-free limit for tourist goods was \$100 from a maximum of \$500 to \$100 two years ago as part of a Kennedy administration drive to reduce the flow of U.S. dollars and gold abroad.

Meanwhile, the U.S. customs bureau decided to defer action for six months on a proposal to reduce the duty-free entry of gift parcels to \$1 from \$10. This proposed reduction also met with Canadian government opposition.

Customs commissioner Philip Nichols Jr. said a lot of parcels are falsely labelled as gifts to avoid duty payments. However, he has observed some reduction of these abuses in recent months and will watch the situation carefully for another six months before deciding whether to impose the proposed restriction or take some other action.

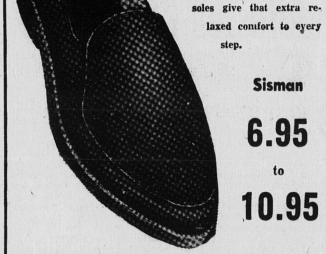
