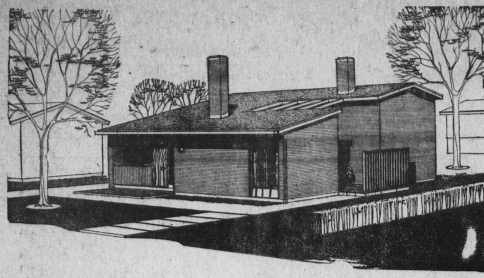
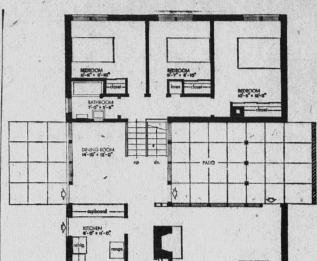


SPLIT-LEVEL ENCLOSES PATIO



THIS U-SHAPED split-level house by architect Rona and Wally of Don Mills, Ontario, embodies many features, including an enclosed patio offering privacy for outdoor living, dining and entertaining. The house provides three bedrooms, grouped on the upper level and reached by a stairway from the central hall. Only the section under the bedrooms is excavated for a basement and it permits space for heating, recessed lighting and washrooms.

The floor area is 1,145 square feet and the exterior dimensions 34 feet by 40 feet. Working drawings for this house, known as Design 767, are available from Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation at minimum cost.



Death Occurs In Orillia, Ont.

SUMMERSIDE — The death of a former Summerside woman Mrs. Ralph Boates, 46, occurred suddenly Friday night in Orillia, Ont.

Mrs. Boates, the former Elinor Ann (Beth) Boates, was received hospital Tuesday and was operated on Friday. Although the exact cause of death is not known, the operation she took a sudden turn for the worse Friday evening there about a year previously.

Mrs. Boates, who was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles Meikle lived all of her life in Summerside until she married in Orillia in 1931. She was a year ago to join her husband who had accepted a position there about a year previously.

In addition to her husband she was survived by two sons, Edward and David both at home. Edward is studying for the ministry. Mrs. David is attending school.

Also surviving is a brother, George Meikle of Summerside. The remains will arrive today at the Bonness Funeral Home where the body will rest until Wednesday afternoon when funeral services will be conducted at Trinity United Church.

Mrs. Boates and his two sons arrived in Summerside yesterday to attend the funeral.

Probe Made Into Death Of Stewardess

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Civil Aeronautics Board said Sunday that preliminary investigation has failed to determine what caused a door to fly open on an Alouette Airlines plane Friday night, sending a stewardess plunging to her death.

A spokesman said that the twin-engine Convair would be sent to the Hartford, Conn., to Washington for further study and analysis of the door locking and release mechanism. Better test equipment is available here, he said.

The accident occurred on a flight from Washington to Providence, R.I. The stewardess, Françoise de Motiere, 29, was sucked out of the plane when the door suddenly blew open.

Her body was found in a field in Winstor Locks. There were no other casualties.

An air leak in the rear door of the plane was discovered by Windsor Locks, Miss de Motiere and the co-pilot, Thomas Hawkins, 34, of Alexandria, Va., attempted to plug the leak with pillows and a sandpaper, a clerk, Mack, 34, of Springfield, Mass.

The first big noise of air stopped, Mack said. Then Miss de Motiere sat down next to him and clasped.

"A little while later, she said, 'Excuse me, I have to announce our descent,'" Mack recalled. "Nothing more was heard from her."

Newman Seeks Case For 'Inadvisable'

NEW DELHI (AP) — Why have India and Communist China not signed a "coexistence" pact, the present bias of border warfare? The conflict, the Chinese contend, is the result of modern nationalisms colliding in an area of historically vague frontiers.

This is the conflict of the Indians versus the Chinese rather than of neutrals versus Communists.

But observers here also believe there is an ideological element in China's motives for attacking India. It is its desire to disrupt India's economic development, to keep India from getting ahead of Russia and China.

The border battles with the Chinese will lead to an increasing diversion of Indian resources from the slow, measured pace of raising living standards. But after years of amouling disputes with China, in which Prime Minister Nehru and other Indian leaders have repeatedly urged for using economic development, the bugles of patriotism now are being blown here.

MUST RESIST

"If we do not resist aggression and fight back, it would drag us down to a unknown people," Nehru told the Indian people Thursday. There have been some calls for sacrifices from the people whose average annual income is \$70.

Each year increases the other of aggression because of competing claims as to where the border lies.

Exterior Finishing Materials Available In Wide Variety

The exterior of a house can be finished anytime after the walls are up and window and door frames installed. However, exterior work may be postponed until interior work is more advanced. The actual scheduling of exterior cladding depends upon the weather, the availability of bricklayers or other subcontractors, delivery of materials at the site, and the individual builder's established method of building.

There is considerable variety in exterior finishing materials. Conventional exterior finishes are masonry veneer, wood siding and stone. New plywood panels, cedar shakes, asbestos siding and shingles, presswood and aluminum siding are competing with traditional materials.

MASONRY VENEER

The choice of material in masonry veneer is important. It is a sound practice to specify in the contract the manufacturer or supplier, as well as the type and grade of brick or selected materials. With regard to brick, price can be considered a reasonably good quality indicator, although weathering properties of masonry veneer materials are not always directly proportional to cost.

Some bricks are more porous than others. Bricks that should be wetted at least ten minutes before they are mortared in place as otherwise they will absorb too much of the mortar contained in the mortar. If mortar dries out too quickly it will not adhere to the brick and will crumble. A method of testing the rate of absorption is given in the book "Housing Standards" which is available from any office of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

Bricks with clipped corners or with chips on the face side should not be used. Because of repeated handling there is bound to be a few chipped bricks in any load.

QUALITY IMPORTANT

Stone for masonry veneer work should be sound, hard and relatively non-porous. Bearing surfaces—that is, the top and bottom of each stone—should be at least four to six inches depending on the thickness of the unit.

The quality of the mortar is important. If the mortar is good it is more likely to be achieved and an effective weathering surface provided. Experts say a poor mortar is the main cause of water seeping through masonry walls. The book "Housing Standards" provides details on proper mortar mixes.

There are a number of things that can down-grade mortar in addition to improper proportioning of the mixture. The mixture may not contain enough water, it may be too dry and set too rapidly. Waiting a long time before using the prepared mortar, or adding fresh ingredients to a batch which has been left standing for a few hours may affect the quality of the mortar and render it unfit as a binder or as a weathering surface.
