The Kingsboro Women's Institute met at the home of Mrs. Wendell Robertson on August 6th with an attendance of thirteen members and four visitors.

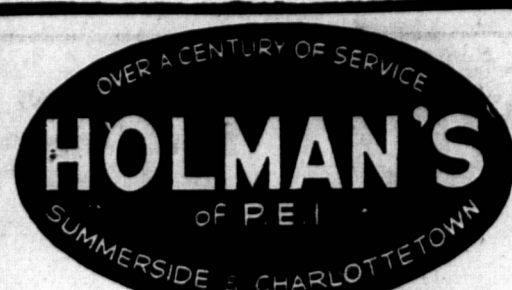
