Ethiopia Claims Find Of Best Quality Uranium in World

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia, (AP)—Emperor Haile Selassie in an interview Saturday announced that some of the best quality uranium ore in the world has been discovered in his remote east African realm.

The emperor said the quantity of uranium—the raw material for atomic energy and explosives—has not been established. A qualified source described the discovery as a "major find."

The official confirmation of the uranium discovery followed by a few hours reports here that Selassie had signed a 99-year agreement giving the United States rights to establish military bases here.

State department officials in Washington said they knew of no agreement signed with Ethiopia except a pact granting the United States the right to continue operating an armed forces radio relay station at Amara, Eritrea, the former Italian colony which has been federated with Ethiopia.

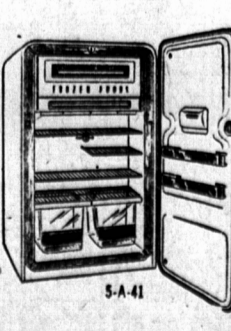

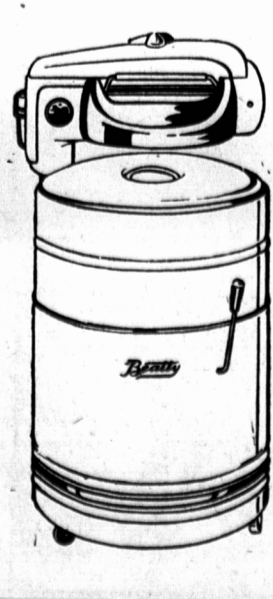
