FREE SEED TESTS.

An Important Privilege Restored by the Dominion Minister of Agriculture.

Farmers and seed merchants will be gratified to hear that the Dominion Minister of Agriculture, Hon. W. R. Motherwell, has determined to restore the privilege of having seed tested at the government laboratories free of charge to the extent of ten samples from each applicant.

While the free privilege is open to all the vitality of seed can be ascertained by farmers and others by planting a hundred or two hundred grains in a flower pot or box of soil, which is kept moist but not wet, and the pot or box placed in a sunny window, but not subjected to either excessive heat or cold.

KEEP GARDEN PRODUCING ALL SEASON.

The garden is generally the richest spot of ground on the farm, and for that reason should be expected to produce more than any other similar area.

There are a number of crops that lend themselves to companion cropping. For example, where onion sets are planted in rows, say 18 inches between the rows, a row of radishes, spinach, or lettuce can be drilled between the rows of onions and be off the ground before the onions need the space.

In warm sections, early peas may be followed by late cabbage, potatoes, snap beans, beets, and turnips. Early potatoes may be followed by turnips, snap beans or by sweet corn.

Fall gardens should in no case be overlooked. Plantings of practically all the early spring vegetables may be made from June to August, according to locality, and be brought to maturity before early autumn frosts.

Most crops mature in a shorter period in the late summer than in the spring. This is due to the shortening of the days and the tendency of the plant to "hurry up" to produce its seed before winter overtakes it.

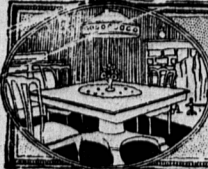

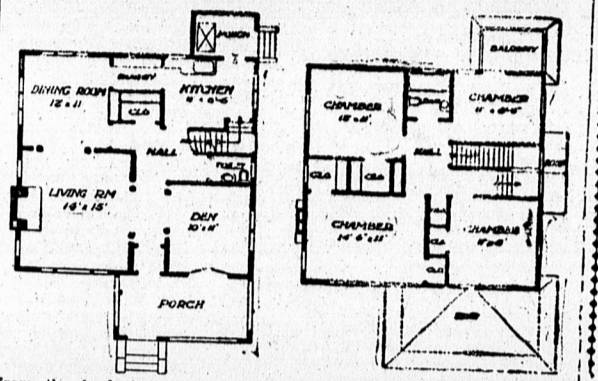

AN ECONOMIC SQUARE HOUSE



The house built on the "square" plan is one of the most practical and economical types of houses to build. First, because such a house has absolutely no waste space and, again, the rooms are more likely to be uniform in size and wall spaces are usually larger, thus allowing for the happy arrangement of one's furniture.



Four bed rooms with ample closets, a linen closet in the hall and a bath room comprise the second floor. There is also an attic for storage and one or more rooms here could be finished, if desired.
