

Bill Haughton Reined Colt Captures Little Brown Jug

DELAWARE, Ohio (AP) — Vicar Hanover, a bay colt owned by Bill Haughton, followed in the footsteps of his father, Torpid, Thursday by winning the 19th annual \$66,500 Little Brown Jug for three-year-old pacers over the Delaware County Fair grounds half-mile oval.

It was the slowest Jug since 1959 but Vicar Hanover, owned by Donald D. Macfarlane of Groves Pointe, Mich., braved 90-degree temperatures and a wind which mounted to 23 miles per hour.

Vicar won \$24,638, boosting his 1964 earnings to \$79,960.

The speedy winner, son of the 1967 Jug champion, took the first heat of the divided feature in 2:02 and came back to win the third in 2:01.

Combat Time, owned by the Tamarack Farms of Painesville, Ohio, and driven by Bruce Nickels of Orlando, Fla., took the second heat in the day's fastest time of 2:00 4/5, and had the colts locked up until the last 30 yards.

LED ALL THE WAY
Combat Time, son of 1963 winner Grand Time, led all the way in the deciding heat until Vicar Hanover collared him late in the stretch and won by less than a length.

Thursday's race, witnessed by about \$5,000, gave Haughton of Gen Head, N.Y., his second Jug conquest. He won in 1952 with Quick Chief.

Two Canadian horses — Red Carpet and Senator Burton — finished fifth and sixth respectively in the third heat. Red Carpet picked up \$8,995 and Senator Burton \$2,995 for their efforts.

Red Carpet, purchased Tuesday for \$100,000 by Adrien and Gerald Miron of St. Augustin, County Deux Montagnes, Quebec, finished third in the first heat after being nipped at the wire by Low Handout, who was owned by Senator Burton, owned by Roland Lavigne of Hull, Que., and was also a third-place finisher in the second heat.

PICKS UP \$15,984
Combat Time, with his 1 1/2 finish, was second and picked up \$13,984.

Sheer Genius, which chased

Combat Time to the wire in the second heat and finished third in the deciding heat, took down \$7,990 which also went into the Haughton wallet. Sheer Genius and Vicar Hanover are stablemates.

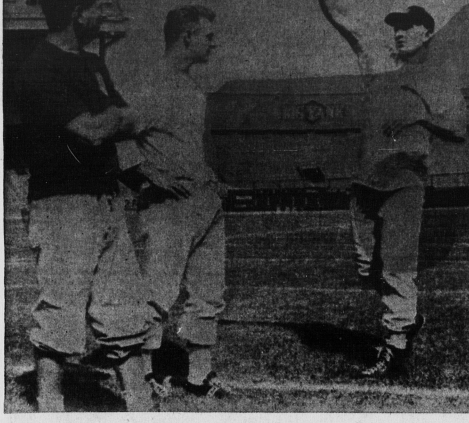
Combat Time, seeking to become only the second Ontario horse to win the Jug, was 4-to-1 favorite in the deciding heat, but couldn't make it hold up.

HUNTER'S CORNER

Trout Season Is Criticized; Black Duck Outlook Is Poor

The speckled trout season has six more days to go. Rainbow trout, being spring spawners, may be legally fished until October 31st. I have heard some caustic comments by a number of trout fishermen regarding the extension of the season from September 15th to the 30th. Many feel it was an ill-considered gesture by a minority group of anglers to which the Department consented after a long and arduous debate into the facts and motives behind this move. There is a strong feeling among a large number of ardent trout fishermen that the September 30th closing date should be set back to September 15th. Trout have been caught this week full of roe the size of lardoons. Such trout are totally unfit for table use as they are inclined to go "mushy" in the pan with no more flavour than a discarded car tire. Furthermore female trout in that condition have a false appetite, some call it a craving for something they want but can't just place what it is. I know of one two pound female trout that was thrown out after it was taken home. It was so flabby and strong smelling.

This columnist cast his last line on September 14th. It was a sort of test case. If the trout are up to par in fable quality okay — if not the rod is stored away until next spring. My first strike was solid and the action was heavy. It was freed after several sharp rushes and proved to be an 8 1/2 inch female with full, rounded sides.
